Please note that police criminal record searches issued more than thirty days from the date of a business license application and from third party sources are not acceptable.

Applicants <u>residing outside</u> of the Region of Peel may obtain a Police Criminal Record Search from Police Services in the area they reside. Peel Regional Police will not accept an application for a Police Criminal Record search from non-residents.

- a. The original Police Criminal Record Check must be delivered IN PERSON to Compliance & Licensing Enforcement, ground floor 300 City Centre Dr., Mississauga ON L5B 3C1.
- b. If the Police Criminal Record Check shows positive of any offence or conviction, the individual will be required to meet with the Manager of Compliance & Licensing Enforcement. Upon approval and all other requirements have been met pertaining to the application, the business licence will be issued.
