STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION

SMART STORMWATER TIPS:

Let stormwater slow down, cool off and stay clean. Let it soak into your yard and keep pollutants out.

Be sure that your property slopes away from your house and other structures.

Disconnect roof downspouts and divert roof water at least 2 m. away to where it can safely soak into the garden and lawn.

Try porous walkways and driveways, rainbarrels and rain gardens to absorb rainwater and native plants beautify your landscape.
