## Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for the Extension of Living Arts Drive

### WHAT?

- The City of Mississauga is studying the need to extend Living Arts Drive, from Rathburn Road West to Centre View Drive, as part of a study called a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA).

### WHY?

- To provide alternative routes to, from, and within downtown Mississauga.
- To support the creation of smaller, urban-scale blocks and a fine-grained street grid in downtown Mississauga.
- To support “multi-modal” transportation by providing additional pedestrian connections, as well as access to existing and planned transit.
- To provide a new north-south multi-modal connection between Rathburn Road West and Centre View Drive, as proposed by the City’s *Downtown21 Master Plan*.

### HOW?

- The study will examine how traffic operates on nearby roadways both now, and in the future. Opportunities to improve the capacity of roadways and intersections within the study area, as well as accommodate future land uses, will also be explored as part of this study.
- Alternative Solutions will be developed and evaluated against a broad range of criteria, related to topics such as transportation, transit, accessibility, land use, the natural and cultural environments, and various others.
- The entire study process will be documented within a Project File, which will be available for public review at the end of the study.

### GET INVOLVED!

- Consultation is an important part of the Class EA process. Throughout the study, the City will engage various agencies and members of the community, and consider their opinions as part of any decisions that are made.
- One Public Information Centre (PIC) is being planned as part of this study to present the: problems and opportunities; Alternative Solutions considered and associated recommendations; and, potential impacts to the environment, with proposed mitigation measures. 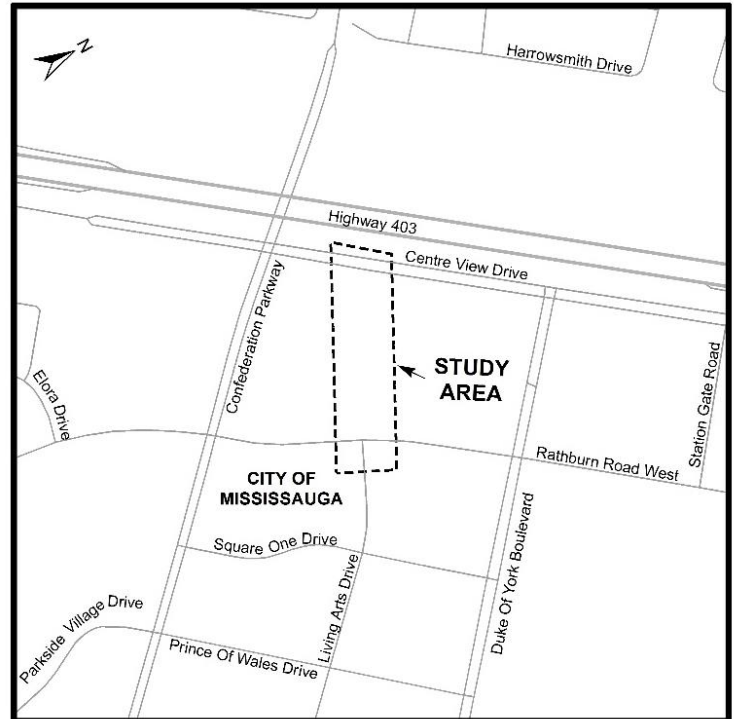

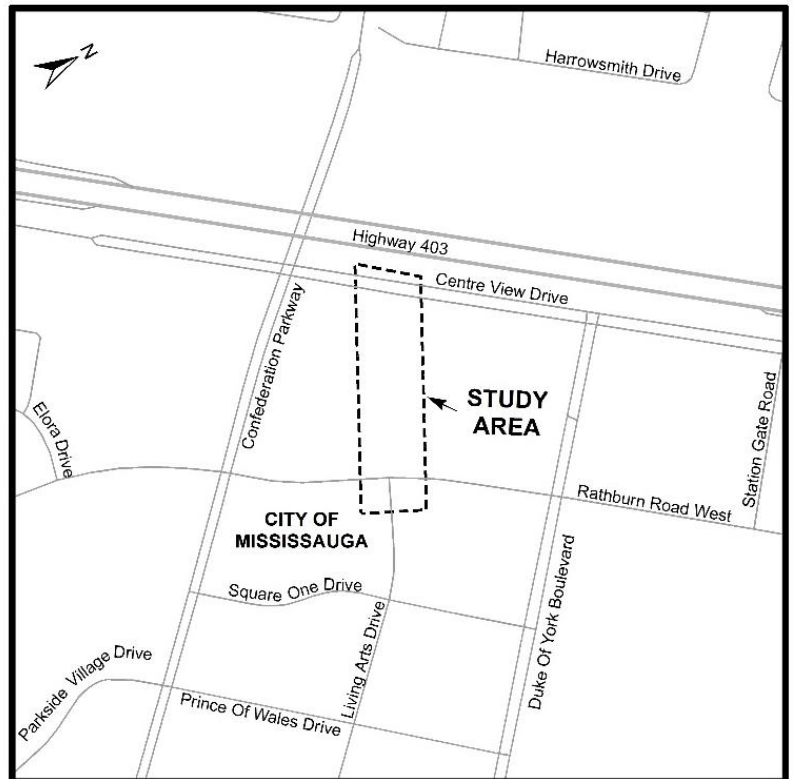

## Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for the Extension of Living Arts Drive

The City of Mississauga has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for the extension of Living Arts Drive, from Rathburn Road West to Centre View Drive (the "Study"). This Study was conducted in accordance with the planning process for 'Schedule B' projects as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document, as amended in 2007, 2011 & 2015, which is approved under the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act*.

The Study was undertaken to investigate the need to:

- provide alternative routes to, from, and within downtown Mississauga;
- support the creation of smaller, urban-scale blocks and a fine-grained street grid in downtown Mississauga;
- support "multi-modal" transportation by providing additional pedestrian and bicycle connections, as well as access to existing and planned transit; and
- provide a new north-south multi-modal connection between Rathburn Road West and Centre View Drive.

Based on the findings of the Study, the extension of Living Arts Drive, from Rathburn Road West to Centre View Drive, was selected as the Preferred Solution, and generally includes the following key elements:

- 26 m right-of-way with new sidewalks and on-street bike lanes;
- new signalized intersection at Living Arts Drive and Centre View Drive; and
- new mid-block intersection.

The configuration of the new mid-block intersection will be established during detailed design.
