

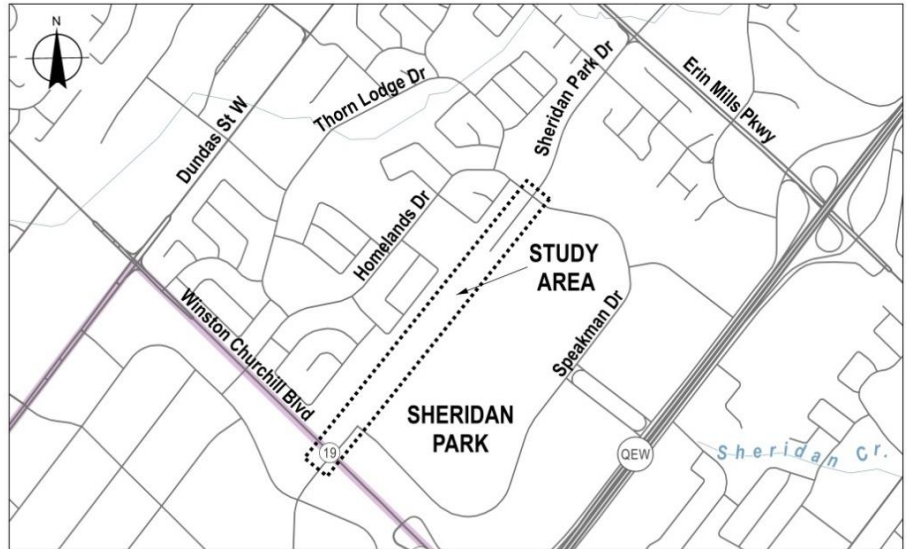
NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for Sheridan Park Drive Extension

The City of Mississauga has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Study for the proposed extension of Sheridan Park Drive between Homelands Drive and Speakman Drive (the “Study”). This Study was conducted in accordance with the planning process for ‘Schedule B’ projects as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Document (October 2000, as amended 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is approved under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*.

The Study was undertaken to investigate the need to:

- complete the road network in the area to improve connectivity in Sheridan Park Corporate Centre (Sheridan Park) and surrounding employment areas for all users;
- maximize access to the Sheridan Park;
- reduce traffic volumes in the Sheridan Homelands neighbourhood; and
- maintain the natural feel and recreational benefits of the Study Area for employees in Sheridan Park and neighbouring residents.



Based on the evaluation of alternatives, the findings of the Study and input from the community and stakeholders, the Preferred Solution is to Extend Sheridan Park Drive.

A two-lane new road segment (extension to the Sheridan Park Drive) is proposed to be constructed along the City-owned right-of-way between Speakman Drive to Homelands Drive. The preliminary design concept for the road extension includes: two vegetated horizontal deflection islands, a roundabout at the Sheridan Park Drive / Speakman Drive intersection; a roundabout at the Sheridan Park Drive / Homelands Drive / Speakman Drive intersection, narrowed roadway pavement width in areas to reduce impacts to existing woodlots, and low impact development features for stormwater treatment and enhanced landscaping.

The Project File Report (“PFR”) has been prepared to document the planning and decision-making process for this Study. By this Notice, the PFR is being placed on the public record for a thirty (30) calendar day review period from and including February 5, 2018 to March 6, 2018 at the following locations:

Interested persons may provide written comments to the City of Mississauga’s Project Manager, Dana Glofcheskie, P.Eng. (see contact information below). If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussions with the City of Mississauga, a person or party may request the Minister of the Environment and Climate Change to make an order (referred to as a Part II Order) for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act, which addresses Individual Environmental Assessments. The written request must be received by the Minister within the thirty (30) calendar day review period noted above, with a copy to the Director, Environmental Assessment and Permissions Branch and the City of Mississauga Project Manager.
