## The Year At A Glance

The Jerry Love Children's Fund is pleased to support the City of Mississauga's Let's Play in the Park program. This free program has now provided 43,594 children with the opportunity to play in the park since 2014!

Since its start in 1985, the Jerry Love Children's Fund has raised more than \$1.8 million to provide children and youth in the City of Mississauga with the means to challenge their abilities, to play, have fun and make friends through participation in sport, art, culture and social recreation activities.

In 2017, the Jerry Love Children's Fund continued its tradition to provide fee assistance support to residents under the age of 15 to participate in City of Mississauga programs operated by Recreation or Culture. A total of **106** children and youth were supported in 2017, resulting in a grand total of 16,102 recipients.



With the City of Mississauga's continued expansion of the *ActiveAssist* Fee Assistance Program, the Jerry Love Children's Fund began to explore other opportunities to eliminate barriers for children to participate in recreation. In 2014, the City of Mississauga launched *Let's Play in the Park*, a free supervised Summer drop-in program for children aged 6 to 12 which include a variety of active games, songs, crafts, and more led by HIGH FIVE® trained City staff.

Thanks to a donation from the Pepsi Foundation, the Jerry Love Children's Fund was pleased to continue its support of this program in 2017 which provided 12,656 children with an opportunity to play in 12 parks across the city in July and August.

### How It Began

Making recreation opportunities available to children in the Community is literally a labour of love for Jerry Love, Mississauga's former Director of Recreation.

Before retiring in 1991, Jerry and Mississauga staff and volunteers spent 35 years offering quality recreation programs to Mississauga's children. During his tenure he came to realize that many families had financial barriers that prevented their children from participating in recreation programs. Jerry was an advocate for a fund that let children, despite family finances, participate in the City's wide range of recreation programs.

When Jerry retired from public service, former Mayor Hazel McCallion paid tribute to his efforts by naming the fund the "Jerry Love Children's Fund".
