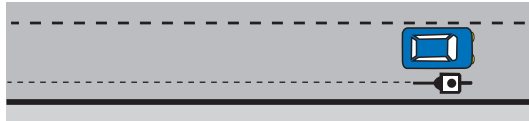
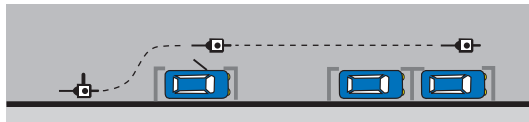


# ROAD POSITIONS FOR CYCLISTS

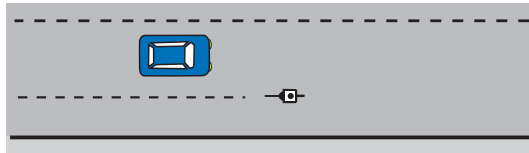

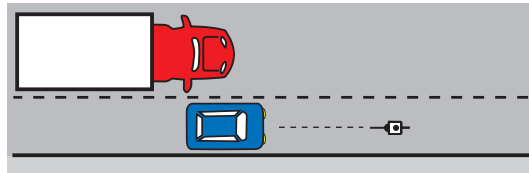
Cyclist's position from curb



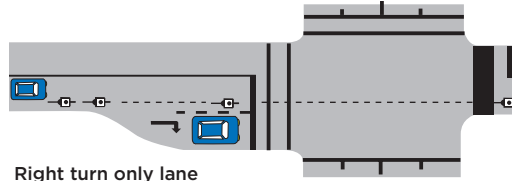
Parked cars



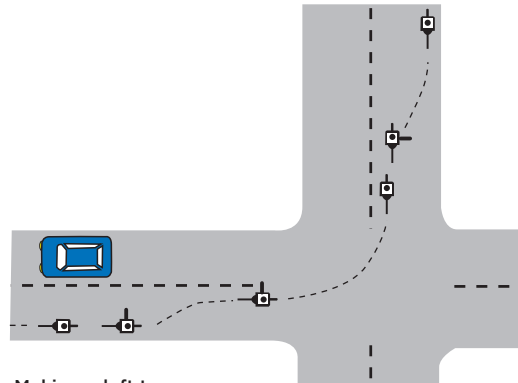
Wide Lane



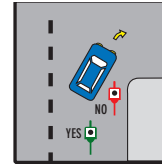
Narrow Lane



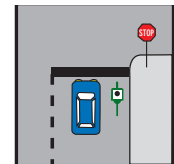
Right turn only lane



Making a left turn



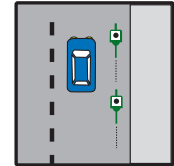
Be careful at intersections.



Obey all traffic laws, signs and signals.



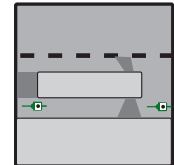
Watch out for parked cars, doors may be opened suddenly.



Ride with the flow of traffic and single file.



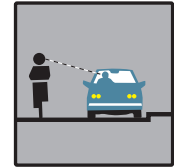
Stay off sidewalks.
