

# 2013 Cultural Heritage Property Awards of Excellence

## CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Presented collaboratively by the Mississauga Heritage Advisory Committee and Heritage Mississauga

### About the Award

The Cultural Heritage Property Award of Excellence program encourages and recognizes excellence in preservation, restoration and/or the enhancement of cultural heritage properties, both built and natural. Jointly presented by the Mississauga Heritage Advisory Committee and Heritage Mississauga, the awards will be announced, and presented, during the annual Heritage Mississauga Awards event on November 21, 2013.

Properties and projects may be nominated in five categories: **Restoration**, **Adaptive Re-Use**, **Sensitive Infill** (for Listed or Designated properties) and **Sensitive Infill** (in a Cultural Landscape) and **Universal Accessibility Design**.

One Award of Excellence will be presented in each category, as determined by the award panel, and based on established criteria.

### Eligibility Criteria

- The property must be located within the city of Mississauga, and must be included on the City's Heritage Register, or in the case of infill, must be adjacent to a property included on the Heritage Register;
- Preference will be given to properties Designated under the *Ontario Heritage Act* (to check the heritage status of a property go to: [www.mississauga.ca/portal/services/property](http://www.mississauga.ca/portal/services/property));
- The project must have been completed within the last two years;
- The project must have received any required City approvals and permits and have been inspected by Heritage Planning Staff to ensure compliance with approved plans and heritage principles.

### Award Categories

- **Restoration:**  
To recognize projects which have undertaken sensitive restoration, with consideration given to quality craftsmanship; the use of appropriate materials; and have adhered to recognized preservation principles.
- **Adaptive Re-use:**  
To recognize projects that have adhered to the principles of sensitive adaptive reuse, with consideration given to how well the project meets current/new needs while maintaining the integrity of the original building, the streetscape, while focusing on the aesthetic quality of the work.
- **Sensitive Infill** (for Designated or Individually Listed properties):  
To recognize sympathetic new construction on both designated or individually listed properties. Eligible work can include an addition or outbuilding or, in rare cases, new construction within a heritage conservation district. The focus will be on the architectural style; the appropriate use of materials; the scale and massing relative to existing architecture in the area; contextual and streetscape considerations; and natural conservation and landscaping elements which are incorporated into the overall design of the property.
- **Sensitive In-fill** (in a Cultural Landscape):  
To recognize sympathetic new construction and/or additions, or outbuildings within a Cultural Landscape. The focus will be on the architectural style; the appropriate use of materials; the scale and massing relative to existing architecture in the area; contextual and streetscape considerations; and natural conservation and landscaping elements which are incorporated into the overall design of the property.

- **Universal Accessibility Design:**

A fifth category has been added to the 2013 Cultural Heritage Property Awards which will recognize accessibility-related projects undertaken to ensure that the building is accessible to all regardless of ability. This focus of the judging, in consultation with the City of Mississauga's Accessibility Advisory Committee, will be the sympathetic restoration, rehabilitation and/or adaptive re-use of the city's heritage buildings, ensuring its accessibility while respecting the heritage fabric of the building.

Properties may be nominated in more than one category, but only one award will be presented to a single property. Submissions must include photographs of all relevant views (with "before" and "after" photos, if possible) along with an outline of the project describing the work that was undertaken. Only exterior work visible from the street will be judged, except in the Universal Accessibility Design category.

## Nomination Process

- Nominations are welcome from anyone;
- Multiple nominations may be submitted; please use a separate application form for each nomination and ensure that each entry indicates a single category of nomination;
- If you don't know all the details requested on the application form, complete as much information as is known and Heritage Planning staff can assist in completing the form, as required.

## Requirements

- Completed entry form (on the next page);
- Photographs (digital preferred) illustrating all relevant views (include "before" photos if possible);
- An outline of the project describing work undertaken.

## Selection

- An Award Panel, comprised of two members from the Mississauga Heritage Advisory Committee and Heritage Mississauga Board, as well as the Mississauga Accessibility Advisory Committee, if and when applicable, with input from City staff, will select the successful nominations;
- Only exterior work visible from the street will be judged, except in the Universal Accessibility Design category;
- Panel reserves the right to withhold award(s) if submissions/nominations do not merit it.
