

On October 27, 2014, Bonnie Crombie was elected as the Mayor of Mississauga. Prior to her election as Mayor, she served as the Ward 5 City Councillor and previous to that, as the Member of Parliament for Mississauga-Streetsville. Prior to seeking elected office, Mayor Crombie worked for two Fortune 500 companies including the Walt Disney Corporation, and McDonald's Corporation. She has also successfully practiced public affairs and launched two successful small businesses, including Cargo Cosmetics, whose products are now sold around the world.
