Helen Noehammer is the Director of Engineering Review with the City of Toronto's Engineering & Construction Services Division. In her current role, Helen is responsible for overseeing the provision of a 'one-window' service to the development industry by providing consolidated comments on all engineering aspects of *Planning Act* applications including traffic operations, stormwater management, site servicing and grading, and solid waste and recyclable collection. Other responsibilities include the review of public utility and third party projects within the public road allowance and the management of City-owned properties with soil and groundwater quality concerns.

Prior to joining Engineering & Construction Services, Helen worked in the Infrastructure Planning Unit of the City of Toronto's Transportation Services Division where she held Manager, Senior Engineer and Planning Engineer positions. In these roles she led multi-disciplinary consultant teams in conducting Class Environmental Assessment studies, functional and preliminary road design studies and in the development of rehabilitation programs. Significant projects included the Gardiner Expressway East Dismantling Class EA, the Front Street Extension Class EA Addenda, the Gardiner Expressway/QEW/Hwy.427/Brown's Line Interchange Modification Class EA and the Gardiner Expressway Rehabilitation Program.

Helen has over 25 years of experience in the engineering field. She joined the City of Toronto in 1994 after working in the private sector and returning to graduate school.

Helen has a Bachelor of Applied Science in Chemical Engineering and a Master of Applied Science in Civil Engineering, both from the University of Toronto.
