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(12) RE: PROPOSED CREDITVIEW ROAD EXPANSION FEBRUARY 10, 2014

To Whom It May Concern;

I am an owner of one of the townhomes that backs on to Creditview Road at Falconer Drive. I am very concerned about the proposed expansion of Creditview for the following reasons:

- Loss of trees and wildlife...there are owls and hawks (not seen in many areas now) nesting in the trees on the east side of the road along with the fox and coyotes that are keeping our rodent population under control and trees of course contribute to air quality. Our wildlife and trees are precious and we need to protect them.

- **Health**...of all of the houses I think our townhomes are physically closest to Creditview. There have been studies completed that prove people who live near high traffic areas suffer more from physical and mental ailments caused by pollution and traffic noise.

- Loss of quiet enjoyment...as it is now when you sit in the backyard on a nice summer day all conversation has to stop until traffic clears and you cannot even do that during rush hour times. When you wish to keep windows open at night for a cool breeze dust, pollution and noise keep you awake. Just imagine what it will be like with two more lanes added! We will not be able to enjoy our back yards as we should.

- Safety...have you ever gotten off the northbound bus at Falconer Drive and tried to cross the road? Well I have and you take your life in your hands to attempt it. With two more lanes it will be next to impossible.

- **Trucks...** As it stands now even with signs posting otherwise (not enforced enough by police) large trucks use Creditview Road as a throughway. When they go by the whole house shakes. With four lanes trucks will be more plentiful because they will assume it will be their right to use this route, causing even more pollution and noise.

- Mavis Road... We were led to understand that Mavis Road was built with four lanes to alleviate traffic from our area. Why now do you think it is wise to expand Creditview also?

I am sure that most homeowners in the area are very concerned with the proposals put forth and hope that you will take into consideration the very serious points that I have brought forward above. Thank you for your time and consideration of my letter.

4. WHEN - we are trying to stop it now before the slow destruction of our neighbourhood starts. The cutting of trees, the plowing up of the soil, the scarring off of animals, and the stress on humans.

5. WHY - as we canvassed hundreds of our neighbours, there are very few that even think this is a good idea. Most people are highly upset about it and think it will be a complete and total destruction of the area and are very concerned as to why the City keeps pushing this when the vast majority of people are firmly against it and don't understand the use of a multi-use trail which is supposed to be picturesque. Even in the City's own drawings of what it will look like, it looks like nothing more than a sea of concrete.

Summary of Questions that we could ask at the Feb 10th meeting or put out in the newsletter, or put to the Reporter.

1. How wide will combination of trail and road make Creditview Road?

2. How far back will the hydro poles go, and on which side? how will it affect in both visual and environmentally the affect of high voltage wires close to houses.

3. How this will affect the animals, as this is a conservation area, will there be barriers to stop them from running across the road?

4. How will the City deal with the sound? present sound barriers are nothing more than window dressing as noted what has already built coming down Creditview from Britannia and what will they look like in a few years after massive amounts of salt have damaged them. They usually turn black when this happens.

5. Can the City show a decibel drop in sound on the second floor of houses?

6. Surrounding streets flowing into the main, how does the City plan to deal with drastic increased traffic on roads not built for that?

7. How hard will it be just for the average person just to get out of their driveway as cars line up to get onto the main artery blocking streets which is already a problem on Kenninghall and Falconer.

8. Who is behind the push for this road expansion? The Company doing the work is also the Company paying for the person overseeing the Environmental part of the project.

9. What are the long term affects of stress on people i.e. not sleeping as well at night because of noise. Not able to enjoy the outdoors because of the constant hum of tires. Congestion on the back streets.

10. What will happen to the small park that is used all day long in the summer, spring and fall - are they going get rid of the picnic tables - the park is used for the main entrance for people boating and canoeing and fishing on the Credit River - what happens to that - does it disappear?

11. How will people on Vanbelt even get onto the road safely as their request for a traffic light has already been turned down. Will we need a loss of life before we get any action? The same for the people requesting a stop light on Falconer exiting onto Creditview.

12. Will there eventually be an on ramp to the 401? which will mean more trucks using Creditview Road.

13. Why is their a push to expand this road when they have just narrowed Bristol Road down to one lane because of the bike trail on both sides which seems to be rarely used. On the same question, why do we not expand Mississauga Road - they are far greater traffic jams around the University from 10 am to 2 pm., yet the City has no plans to expand that area - is it because those are wealthy homes and we are considered working class?

14. All other streets leading into the 401 with on ramps except for Winston Churchill which was purposely designed with the housing pushed far back and much higher and much thicker sound barriers installed - all other roads have a least one kilometer of industrial or commercial area prior to getting onto the 401. On Creditview from Burnhamthorpe to north of 401 is all residential.

15. How does the City plan to let people make left hand turns onto Kenninghall Blvd with will have to be at a higher speed to cross two lanes and more distance and then slow into an area which is known as the school bus drop-off and it is less than a quarter block in, not to mention the residents of Kenninghall who will have to make a left hand turn almost immediately after the first left hand turn which will be a high probability of rear end collisions.

16. What about the overall pollution from the number of vehicles, first of all idling cars spitting out tons of carbon monoxide? oil and rad fluid dripping from cars close to the river, the spray of salt from four lanes of traffic and the tripling amount of salt that will have to used in this area - what will be the affect on nearby vegetation especially trees and plants east of Creditview due to the prevailing winds which is right in line with the park. The increased noise pollution which we have already seen drastically increased in the last two years which will triple that.

17. Why is the City being so veg about the Plan - handing out pamphlets to only certain home owners, continuous use of the word minimal, making our concerns seem irrational. Why is the study so narrow?

The City keeps using the phrase, "It has been on the books for years" yet we have residents that have lived here for even longer and their concerns are not being met.

18. I feel there should be an independent study on the environmental effects on the animals, plants, fish, and birds.

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

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

We are aware that city is planning to conduct its first PIC on improvements on Creditview Rd. Following are the water and wastewater comments:

<u>Water</u>: There is a planned new 400mm watermain on Creditview Rd from Argentia Rd to Old Creditview Rd (crossing Hwy 401), scheduled to be constructed in 2013/ 2014. Watermain on rest of the section is in good condition. <u>The proposed</u> widening of Creditview Rd definitely needs to be coordinated with planned water works.

<u>Wastewater</u>: The existing 1500mm CPP sewer on Creditview Rd from Old Creditview Rd to Hwy 401 has been installed recently in 2010 and is in good condition. Sewer from 200m South of Kenninghall Cr to 250m North of Kenninghall Cr has been scheduled for trenchless repairs for 2015. There are no other wastewater concerns for that stretch of pipe. Please note that Region is currently twinning the West Trunk Sewer that crosses the Creditview Rd. <u>Sewer twinning timelines need to be coordinated with Ajay Puri (concerned PM).</u>


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Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for Creditview Road

Project Status

The first Public Information Centre (PIC #1) was held on February 10, 2014 to receive public input, comments and concerns on the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for Creditview Road. The study area shown below is limited to Old Creditview Road and Bancroft Drive, excluding the bridge across the Credit River. An Environmental Assessment was previously completed for this bridge.

Approximately 110 individuals attended PIC #1 and offered a wide range of opinions to the project team members. The preliminary preferred alternative solutions presented at PIC #1 are currently under review by staff and the consulting team. Part of this process is to review the comments that were received from the public to incorporate any concerns



or suggestions into the preferred solution. With respect to the study schedule, PIC #2 will be held later this year or early 2015 to present the design alternatives, their evaluation and the preferred design. At that PIC, a summary of the public comments that have been received on the project and how they will be addressed will be presented. Subsequent to that, the Notice of Study Completion will be issued and the Environmental Study Report will be made available for a 30 day public review period. Upon confirmation of PIC #2, the notification will be advertised in the Mississauga News and invitation letters will be sent to those who are on the study mailing list.
