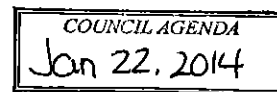

SUBJECT: **2014 Interim Tax Levy For Properties on the
Regular Instalment Plan**

- RECOMMENDATION:**
1. That a by-law be enacted to provide for a 2014 interim tax levy for properties on the regular instalment plan.
 2. That the 2014 interim taxes be calculated to be 50% of the previous year's annualized taxes on properties that existed on the previous year's tax roll.
 3. That assessments added to the tax roll in the current year be levied an amount that approximates 50% of a full year's taxes, had the property been included on the previous year's tax roll, using tax rates set out in Appendix 1 to the report dated January 6, 2014 from the Commissioner of Corporate Services and Chief Financial Officer and the current year's phased-in assessment.
 4. That the 2014 interim levy for residential properties on the regular instalment plan be payable in three (3) instalments on March 6th, April 3rd, and May 1st, 2014.
 5. That the 2014 interim levy for regular instalment plan properties in the commercial, industrial and multi-residential property classes be payable in one (1) instalment on March 6th, 2014.

BACKGROUND:

The *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25* provides municipalities with the ability to pass a by-law to levy interim taxes in order to meet financial obligations. A by-law for interim taxes for taxpayers on pre-authorized payment plans was passed by Council on November 20, 2013. This report provides for an interim billing for properties on the regular instalment plan.

COMMENTS:

Section 317 of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25* allows municipalities to levy interim taxes. The amount levied on a property may not exceed 50% of the total amount of taxes levied on the property for the previous year, adjusted for any supplementaries or cancellations that applied to only part of the previous year as if the supplementary or cancellation had applied for the entire year. Any impact resulting from reassessment and phase-in along with budgetary increases are applied on the final bill.

Assessments added to the tax roll for the current year are to be levied an amount that approximates 50% of a full year's taxes, had they been included in the previous year's tax roll, using tax rates set out in Appendix 1 and the current year's phased-in assessment.

Interim levies are also made on Payment-in-lieu properties such as Canada Post, the Region of Peel and others.

An interim levy would allow the municipality to meet its financial obligations including payment of Region of Peel and school board requirements.

It is proposed that the 2014 interim levy for residential properties with regular instalment due dates be payable in three (3) instalments on March 6th, April 3rd, and May 1st, 2014 and that the 2014 interim levy for commercial, industrial, and multi-residential properties on the regular instalment plan be payable in a single instalment on March 6th, 2014.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: Not applicable

CONCLUSION:

A 2014 interim tax levy is required so that the City of Mississauga can meet its financial obligations. The 2014 interim levy for those properties paying through the regular instalment plan will be calculated pursuant to Section 317 of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25* to be 50% of the annualized taxes levied on the property in the previous year. Interim taxes for assessments added to the tax roll for the current year will be calculated using tax rates set out in Appendix 1 and the current year's phased-in assessment.

Instalment due dates for residential properties paying through the regular instalment plan will be March 6th, April 3rd, and May 1st, 2014. The instalment due date for commercial, industrial or multi-residential properties will be March 6th, 2014.

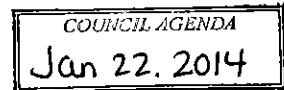

RECOMMENDATION: That a by-law be enacted to authorize the Commissioner of Transportation and Works and the City Clerk to execute and affix the Corporate Seal to the Municipal Works Servicing Agreement and Acknowledgement Agreement between Orlando Corporation and The Corporation of the City of Mississauga to the satisfaction of the City Solicitor as outlined in the Corporate Report dated January 7, 2014 from the Commissioner of the Transportation and Works Department.

BACKGROUND: Appendix 1 indicates the location of the proposed municipal works in support of the New Office Complex at 60 Standish Court under Site Plan Application SP-12/134.


COMMENTS: Orlando Corporation, pursuant to Site Plan application SP 12/134, is responsible for the construction of certain municipal works in support of their proposed New Office Complex. These works include the construction of a municipal storm sewer within a new municipal easement as well as access and sidewalk works within the Cantay Road and Standish Court rights-of-way. To facilitate

the construction of these works, Orlando Corporation will be required to enter into Municipal Works Servicing Agreement with the City of Mississauga. Orlando Corporation will also be required to enter into an Acknowledgment Agreement with the City of Mississauga to identify the specific terms and requirements governing the construction and maintenance of any private works that are proposed to be located within the new municipal easement.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: Not applicable.

CONCLUSION: Orlando Corporation is constructing certain works associated with the New Office Complex. As these works are located within a municipal easement and within the rights-of-way of Cantay Road and Standish Court, Orlando Corporation is required to enter into Servicing and Acknowledgement Agreements with The Corporation of the City of Mississauga.

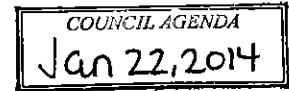

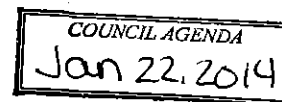

Dog-lover wants City to ban owners from leaving pets outside in bad weather

MISSISSAUGA —A Mississauga man plans to appear before City councillors later this month to ask for changes to a bylaw so dogs can't be left outside in extremely cold weather. Shane McNeil, a former director with Leash-Free Mississauga and current liaison on the organization's fence replacement project, is frequently out in his neighbourhood near the City Centre walking his dog. McNeil said there's a home in the area that leaves several dogs outside in cages pretty much all day, year-round, and it concerned him considering how cold it was. After speaking with his ward councillor Nando Iannicca and Ward 2 Councillor Pat Mullin, McNeil will come before Council on Jan. 22 to ask councillors to have staff review the current bylaw and see if changes can be made. Specifically, he would like to see a provision that requires owners to bring their dogs indoors when it's either too hot or too cold.

"When the temperature reaches a certain threshold, owners should have to take the dog inside," said McNeil. "People today have a different view about leaving dogs out in the freezing cold than they did 50 or 100 years ago."

That's why he wants staff to review the bylaw and see if it can be changed to reflect society's current morals when it comes to dogs.

The current bylaw doesn't require owners to bring their animals inside in extreme weather. However, it does contain specifics on the type of enclosures owners can have for their animals such as being made of durable material, are waterproof and kept in a good state of repair. Mickey Frost, the City of Mississauga's director of enforcement, said Animal Services has received "quite a few" complaints about animals being left outdoors in the extremely cold weather. When a complaint is received, an Animal Services officer is sent to investigate and ensure the owner is in compliance with existing bylaws and that the animal is receiving the proper care.

Frost said owners can visit the Animal Services website (mississauga.ca/portal/residents/animalservices) for tips on keeping pets safe.

McNeil also wants to see changes to require homeowners to let their animals out of cages for a specific amount of time each day.

"There should be some sort of time (limit) where you have to let them out of the cage," said McNeil. "Even if it's just two hours a day, it's more humane than nothing."

On January 22, 2014, 9 am, the City of Mississauga councillors will consider to open a ByLaw and stop allowing dog owners to leave their dogs locked 24/7 in dog cages in their backyards. As it stands now, dog owners are permitted to do such a thing, and there is nothing Animal Services can do about it. This is a chance to have your say, please sign this petition and stand up for the poor animals who can't stand up for themselves.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- The Diversity and Inclusion Charter of Peel is a community initiative that aims to foster inclusiveness and equity in Peel region.
- The Charter was launched in April 2013 and has been endorsed by a number of agencies including the Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration, Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, Peel Regional Police, the Town of Caledon, and the Peel District School Board, among others.
- In the context of Peel's diverse and growing population, the Charter illustrates how organizations and individuals across all sectors can work together to build an "inclusive Peel Region that values, respects and embraces diversity and equity so that everyone can achieve their full potential".
- The Charter commitments are aligned with existing Regional initiatives such as the Diversity and Inclusion Strategy and the Canadian Coalition of Municipalities Against Racism and Discrimination.

DISCUSSION

1. Background

The Diversity and Inclusion Charter of Peel is a region-wide initiative to foster inclusiveness and equity. A 10-person committee with representatives from the non-profit, public, private, education, health and settlement sectors, (including a representative from the Region of Peel), provided guidance on the development and launch of the Charter. The Diversity and Inclusion Charter of Peel was developed through community engagement to ensure it is by and for everyone who lives, works and plays in Peel.

2. Vision and Commitments

The Charter's Vision is "an inclusive Peel Region that values, respects and embraces diversity and equity so that everyone can achieve their potential."

To realize this vision, individuals and organizations who endorse the Diversity and Inclusion Charter of Peel commit to:

- Providing ongoing learning that facilitates equity and inclusion at individual, organizational and community levels
- Creating safer spaces that foster mutual understanding, respect and growth
- Supporting inclusive leaders and change champions
- Dedicating resources, including people, time and/or money, to equity and inclusion
- Building transparent and accountable relationships and systems
- Partnering and collaborating to support and build equity and inclusion
- Recognizing individuals and organizations implementing best practices in equity and inclusion

4. Alignment with existing commitments



Dear Mr. Mayor: *Dear Mayor McCallion,*

The Office of the Prime Minister forwarded your correspondence of September 30, 2013 concerning Heavy Urban Search and Rescue (HUSAR) teams across Canada.

Our Government recognizes the importance of promoting an integrated and resilient approach to emergency management and has invested over \$175 million since 1980. Of this, approximately \$23 million has been provided to the HUSAR Task Forces (TFs) located across Canada since 2001. Tragedies such as the flooding in Alberta, the train derailment in Lac-Mégantic, Quebec and the 2012 Johnson Landing Slide in British Columbia serve as a reminder that emergency management is a shared responsibility between all levels of government, the private sector, non-governmental organizations and individual citizens. The majority of emergencies in Canada are local in nature and are managed by local or provincial governments.

Federal contributions for emergency preparedness projects under the Joint Emergency Preparedness Program (JEPP), including funding provided for Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) and HUSAR, ended March 31, 2013. Through its work with the HUSAR Task Forces, Public Safety (PS) played a leadership role in the establishment of training and equipment standards, as well as investing in purchases of goods and services in the establishment of the TFs. This program was examined closely given that activities and spending identified fall under areas of provincial jurisdiction.

Our government remains committed to working in close collaboration with provinces and territories to ensure a safe and resilient Canada and to deliver better programs and better results to Canadians. It is important for all governments to refocus programs and service delivery to better ensure that we are effectively addressing the current national safety and security priorities of Canadians.

Dear Mr. Prime Minister:

It has been brought to my attention that federal funding came to an end on March 31st of this year for Heavy Urban Search and Rescue (HUSAR) teams across the country. The City of Mississauga firmly believes this funding should be restored.

These teams require highly technical training and specialized equipment and respond to low frequency, high hazard and very visible events with the potential for much loss of life.

Maintaining these skills within a limited number of fire departments across the country through federal funding support is a very effective way to maintain a high level of readiness in centrally located cities where these skills can be accessed by other municipalities. Funding these programs only at the local level by a few large cities leads to the risk they will be abandoned as too expensive for a localized tax source to support. This in turn negatively impacts the availability of these rescue programs to all municipalities.

National leadership is required for this type of emergency readiness to best match nationwide funding resources against the likelihood of serious emergencies either natural or manmade occurring anywhere in the country.

On behalf of the citizens of Mississauga, I urge the Federal Government to restore this funding to ensure all communities in Canada have access to these specialized skills whenever they are needed.

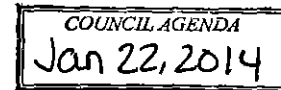



AND WHEREAS on October 1, 2013, Mississauga City Council considered a report titled "*Brampton's Request for Additional Regional Representation at Regional Council*" which proposed that the membership of Region of Peel Council should be based on the principles of efficiency and cost; fairness; and, representation by population and directed staff to undertake a public survey of City of Mississauga residents on this matter;

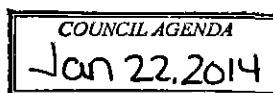

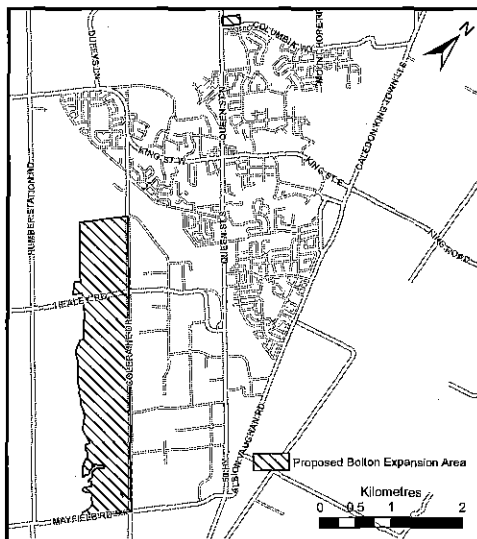

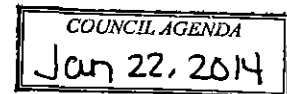

Good morning. As a concerned Mississauga resident, I am requesting from the City Clerk, that an item be provided to all Mississauga City Councillors. I am making this request at the suggestion of Councillor Pat Mullin.

RE: The matter in question pertains to dogs being left outside, 24/7, of 211 Macedonia Cres. On this past Friday, January 3, 2014, Police and Animal Services responded to 211 Macedonia Cres. Residents of this Ward-7 neighbourhood, have grave concerns over the 3 dogs of this residence, always being locked and caged outside, in extreme-cold temperatures. It appears the dogs are never let out of their cages; not for a walk nor to even relieve themselves. I made notice of this, as in their backyard, I noticed absolutely no dog prints nor evidence of dog urination in their snow. The snow was completely undisturbed by any dog. I and other residents have also noticed over a long period of time -- greater than a year -- that the 3 dogs are absolutely never out of their small locked cages, of about 3-4 X 3-4 feet, no matter what time we walk by. As the backyard of 211 Macedonia cres is directly adjacent to a school yard, it is frequented by many residents walking their own dogs. We have all noticed the on-going and never-ending neglect of these dogs in question.

I have since written to both Councillors Mullin and Iannicca. Councillor Mullin suggested I write to the City Clerk, this Monday morning, to place this as an information item; so that all councillors would be fully made aware of the situation; and for discussion by the councillors, and possibly to be included in a formal City Council meeting.

My email to Councillor Iannicca:

"Good morning Councillor Iannicca. In this extreme cold we are having, many of my neighbours have noticed a particular house where there are 3 dogs being caged in a backyard. These dogs are never taken inside, and it strongly appears they are never being let out of their cages; which are very small dog enclosures. I feel that with the extreme weather, this is just not right of people to allow such a thing. It is much too cold to leave dogs this way. In such weather, a dog wouldn't even have access to water, as water I'm sure freezes very quickly in these temperatures. The dogs are also in such a small always-locked enclosure of about 3-4x3-4 feet, that they do not have enough space to even generate enough body heat to stay warm. As I received Friday night an email from a worried resident, I did contact both Animal Services and Peel Police. Both responded to the house at 211 Macedonia Cres. Animal Services investigated and saw all three dogs being tightly caged in this extreme cold. The investigator claimed he warned the owner about certain violations, but said he could not seize the dogs, mainly due to current laws, By-Laws.

Therefore, without the City's help, the owner is permitted to leave his dogs this way, outside in dangerously freezing-cold temperatures. The investigator also claimed that because the dogs are husky breed that they "liked" the cold and "preferred" it cold. You should know that the dogs in question are not pure-breed huskies, but mixed breeds with very short-hair coats, like a boxer breed. I also don't ever recall seeing Animal Services house their husky breed dogs in outside cages in winter months; nor have I ever heard of any shelter on this continent that has such a practice. I'm sure the public would be outraged if they ever saw dogs of any breed being housed outside by any animal shelter. All dogs, including husky breed dogs, are housed inside in heated cages that are three times the size of the cages in question. Even wild dogs such as coyotes and wolves have a practice to den from the cold, as a survival instinct. Dogs do die in such extreme-cold temperatures, domesticated or wild.

I have recently worked with Leash-Free Mississauga as a director, and as such I have met several of the other City councillors. With Councillor Pat Mullin's help and support, I am the director responsible for the new fencing projects, at both Parkway Belt and Lakeside. I was also invited by Toronto councillor Denzil Minnan-Wong to give an expert deputation on matters concerning dogs and leash-frees. Councillor Mullin is also aware of the situation at 211 Macedonia cres, and she suggested I inform your office. She also suggested that I today contact the City Clerk to have this matter included as an information item for council discussion.

I hope that I and the many concerned residents of Ward 7 can count on your support. As we are experiencing a brutally-cold winter, Council's urgent attention is required on this matter. Please let me know if you can offer some assistance and support, for the dogs in question."

Please let me know if you require any further information on my part. Please let me know more about the process, in having this urgent matter brought forward to Council's attention. Thank-you.

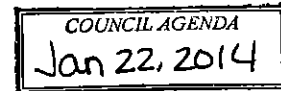

We have been instructed by our client, which operates within the boundaries of the City of Mississauga, to bring to your attention that a number of mobile signs permitted to Curbex Ltd. by the City seem to contravene the City of Mississauga Mobile Sign By-law 0054-02 (the "By-law").

Specifically, these mobile signs, which are a large printed vinyl adhered to a steel and aluminum frame that do not contain interchangeable lettering, contravene the By-law in that they are colour greater than the two lines allowable and not either black on white or white on black, have oversized wording, and the toppers of these mobile signs exceed the number of sign faces allowable under the By-law.

As a conscientious mobile sign company, our client seeks to ensure the By-law is consistently enforced so as not to provide an unfair advantage to any one company. Accordingly, our client has instructed us to request that this letter be presented to Council at their next sitting for a determination on the status of these new mobile signs.

WHEREAS the City of Mississauga experienced a severe ice storm on December 21 and 22nd causing damage to many trees on private property resulting in extensive tree debris which must be cleaned up, increasing yard maintenance costs to low income seniors or disabled residents;

AND WHEREAS the City currently has a Yard Maintenance Subsidy Program that provides a maximum subsidy of \$200 per year for eligible low income seniors and disabled residents for snow removal and grass cutting, based on actual expenditures;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That for the 2014 and 2015 Yard Maintenance Subsidy Programs an additional subsidy of \$200 be provided for the actual costs for removal of tree debris from the 2013 ice storm, for low income seniors or disabled residents who meet the eligibility criteria for the Yard Maintenance Subsidy.

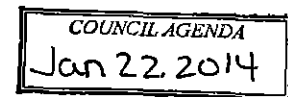


Whereas at the Governance Committee meeting on January 13, 2014, direction was given to staff to prepare revised wording to the Council Code of Conduct, Rule 7, Improper Use of Influence, Section 2 regarding attendance at adjudicative board meetings;

And Whereas the direction was to allow Councillor's to attend meetings to address adjudicative boards and provide notice to the Committee of Adjustment Secretary/Treasurer;

Now therefore be it resolved that Rule 7, Improper Use of Influence, Section 2, of the Council Code of Conduct be revised to state:

Members shall not contact members of any tribunal regarding any matter before it, such as the Committee of Adjustment, which is charged with making independent decisions and whose members have been appointed by Council. Members may with prior written notice to the Committee of Adjustment Secretary/Treasurer and in consultation with the Integrity Commissioner, infrequently attend meetings to provide the Committee of Adjustment with history and context of an application before the committee. Members may send a letter or E-mail addressed to the Secretary of such tribunal expressing the views of the member on behalf of the community. Members shall not make representations of any kind to other tribunals such as the OMB but may request Council to instruct the City Solicitor to appear in a case before such tribunal.



WHEREAS section 310(1) of the *Municipal Act* allows the Council of an upper-tier municipality through by-law to delegate the establishment of tax ratios for the year within the lower-tier municipality for both lower-tier and upper-tier purposes;

AND WHEREAS section 310 (2) of the *Municipal Act* requires all of the lower-tier municipalities within an upper-tier municipality to pass a resolution consenting to the Regional by-law;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. That Council consent to the enactment of a Regional by-law delegating tax ratio setting from the Region of Peel to Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon, in accordance with section 310 of *The Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25* for the 2014 property tax year;
2. That Council consent to the apportionment methodology in place in the 2013 taxation year updated for 2014 assessments.
