(a) Hope 24/7 Crisis and Clinical Intervention Centre

Laura Zilney, CEO of Hope 24/7 Crisis and Clinical Intervention Centre spoke to the services that Hope 24/7 offers residents.

(b) Indigenous Awareness

Eddy Robinson spoke to indigenous awareness and requested that City of Mississauga declare an Indigenous Celebration Day and spoke about November 8, 2015 being Aboriginal-Canadian Veteran's Day. Councillor Tovey spoke about his involvement with the aboriginal culture. Councillor McFadden requested that Mr. Robinson's deputation and his request for an Indigenous Celebration Day be referred to the Diversity and Inclusion Advisor Committee's next meeting.

(c) Public Apology

Jonathan D. Silbert, Ward 9 resident requested a public apology from Mayor Crombie for comments for her remarks that unfairly accused Meadowvale residents of having a racist intent in their opposition of the proposed Meadowvale Islamic Centre and her comments made during the mayoral election debate on October 14, 2014. Councillors Parrish, Iannicca and Carlson indicated that at the September 21, 2015, Planning and Development Committee meeting members of Committee listened to all resident's concerns and that the application meet all the planning merits. They further indicated that Mayor Crombie did not owe anyone an apology, as Mayor she represents all residents who can or cannot speak for themselves. Mayor Crombie indicated that she stood by the remarks made on the specific planning application and further indicated that she would always stand up for tolerance, respect, decency and civil society. Councillor Saito indicated that the she spoke with the individual resident in regards to the website and literature in questions which was taken down and content was changed, she further introduced a motion asking Mayor Crombie to apologize and the motion failed.

(d) Meadowvale Islamic Centre

Ian Vice, resident, spoke in opposition to the Meadowvale Islamic Centre raising concerns regarding safety of children, parking and traffic. Councillor Ras indicated that she visited the site and noticed that high school students were crossing the road against the light. Councillor McFadden indicated that this has been an issue in that area because students do not use the lights to cross the road. Councillor Saito indicated that she had fencing installed and traffic lights with an automatic walk signal that is timed with school arrivals and departures to encourage students to use the proper crossing. She further indicated that the schools in the area are not cooperating with the implementation of the use of the traffic lights and automatic walk signal.

Councillor Saito indicated that a steering committee would be formed to address the site plan application and she further indicated that the Meadowvale community will heal, as it is a strong community.
