- A. Marlaine Koehler, Executive Director, Waterfront Regeneration Trust with respect to Greenbelt Cycling Route Report.

Marlaine Koehler, Executive Director, Waterfront Regeneration Trust outlined the visions and goals of the Greenbelt Foundation Routes, newly created signage along 462km of cycling infrastructure which stretches along 7 regions, economic benefits and partnerships. Ms. Koehler spoke to an August 2015 bike ride launch taking place from August 16 – August 21, 2015 to showcase the Greenbelt Foundation Routes.

Subject: 2014 Cycling Network Program: Year-End Report

The City of Mississauga Cycling Master Plan outlines a strategy to build an integrated on-road and off-road cycling network as part of a multi-modal transportation system, as well as a wide range of accompanying programs and policies to enhance cycling.

The 2014 Cycling Network Program included the development of bicycle lanes, signed routes and multi-use trails in several locations. The project locations were aligned with the criteria contained within the Cycling Master Plan. For each location, consultation with the respective Ward Councillor and area residents was completed, where required.

This report provides a year-end summary of the status of 2014 cycling network projects. This work represents projects managed by the City's Transportation and Works Department and Community Services Department, as well as projects completed by the Region of Peel where indicated.

As this report indicates, much of the focus of cycling network development in 2014 has been on projects that are in the planning and design phase.

In addition to the projects listed in this report, Active Transportation staff have participated in project teams for Environmental Assessments that propose to include cycling facilities as part of future capital projects:

- Courtneypark Dr.: Kennedy Rd. to Dixie Rd. - Proposed multi-use trail
- Creditview Rd.: Bancroft Dr. to Old Creditview Rd. – Proposed multi-use trail
- Hurontario LRT: Brampton to Port Credit – Proposed cycling facilities (various)
- McLaughlin Rd.: Bristol Rd. to Britannia Rd. – Proposed bicycle lanes / sharrows
- Ninth Line: Derry Rd. W. to Hwy. 401 – Proposed multi-use trail
- Second Line: Donway Dr. to Sombrero Way – Proposed bridge over Hwy 401

Subject: **Summary: 2014 Bicycle Count Program**

INTRODUCTION

In 2014, the City of Mississauga started conducting bicycle counts on an ongoing basis, to gather data about the amount of cycling traffic at various locations, following the pilot use of bicycle count equipment in the fall 2013.

The objectives of the 2014 Bicycle Count Program were as follows:

- To design an ongoing bicycle count program for the City that provides reliable information on volumes and travel behaviour of cyclists;
- To provide count data on a regular schedule to ensure that the City has up-to-date information for identified locations;
- To maintain a measure of flexibility for the count program to address area specific needs that support special studies (i.e. Environmental Assessment studies);
- To provide count data in a cost effective manner that can be sustained for the long term;
- To provide Mississauga-specific bicycle count data to support a wide variety of decision-making processes; and
- To allow the City to measure the impacts/benefits of the investment made by the City in developing a cycling-supportive transportation system.

TYPE OF COUNTERS

The City of Mississauga currently has three types of bicycle counters:

1. **MOBILE TUBE COUNTERS:** The mobile tube counter is a temporary counter intended for 2-4 weeks duration at a particular location. In 2014, the City rotated the mobile tube counters at 4 key locations with established bicycle lanes (Bristol Road, Camilla Road, Truscott Drive and Erin Centre Boulevard).

2. **ON ROAD LOOP COUNTERS:** The on-road loop counter is comprised of sets of loops installed at permanent locations across the City. The counter equipment can be rotated between these locations. Presently the loop counters are installed on Confederation Parkway, Mississauga Road and Tenth Line West. These counters have been collecting data since October 2013.

3. **PERMANENT MULTI-USE TRIAL COUNTER:** This counter is a loop counter installed along a multi-use trail. It records direction of travel and number of cyclists. This counter is installed on the Burnhamthorpe Trail in the downtown core.

OVERALL FINDINGS

Bristol Road

- 90% increase in ridership in comparison to 2013 counts
- 2013: Average 36 cyclists/day
- 2014: Average 67 cyclists/day
- 40% of trips on weekends

Confederation Parkway

- 2014: Average 69 cyclists/day
- Busiest Day: Bike to Work Day, 222 cyclists
- 30% of trips on weekend
- Busiest day of the week: Monday, 20% of trips

BICYCLE COUNT DATA & THE TRAFFIC COUNT PROGRAM

As part of the on-going Traffic Count Program, Traffic Operations conducts over 300 Turning Movement Counts (TMCs) on an annual basis around the City of Mississauga. As part of this program bicycle counts have recently been included in the annual TMCs. In addition, the Region of Peel conducts cordon counts across the City.

In comparing the bicycle count data to vehicle data, a percentage of trips by bicycle can be calculated. Overall the locations counted showed .5% - 1.5% of trips completed by bicycle. The overall mode share by bike in Mississauga is 0.3% (2011 Transportation Tomorrow Survey).

The top three locations counted were as follows:

- Truscott Drive 1.5% trips by bike
- Camila Road 1.3% trips by bike
- Mississauga Road 0.9% trips by bike

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2015 BICYCLE COUNT PROGRAM

The following recommendations will be considered to expand upon the Bicycle Count Program in 2015:

- Rotate the count equipment for the on-road loop counter on a 4-week period, using the same time period for 2014 as a comparison (i.e. Confederation Parkway mid-May – mid-June, Mississauga Road mid-June-mid-July, Tenth Line mid-July – mid-August etc.)
- Expand the mobile tube counter program to 10 different locations for 2-weeks at each location between mid-May and mid-October. This would involve:
 - Purchase of a 2nd mobile tube counter, so that both directions of travel can be counted during a 2-week period;
 - Purchase of a 3rd mobile tube counter to collect data on our boulevard multi-use trails or be used as a floater mobile counter;
 - Starting the mobile tube counter program mid-May to mid-October (10 potential locations, 2-week periods); and
 - Continuing to use the same locations for 2015 to compare to previous year's data.
