

2. Making Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee (MCAC) Meetings More Effective

Donnie Morris, MCAC Chair led a discussion on how to make Mississauga Cycling Committee meetings more effective and noted the following strategies:

- Conduct the meetings in a more businesslike manner.
- Determine which staff group is most appropriate to refer matters to for analysis and follow up.
- If a Member is to present an item for consideration, discussion or information the Member is responsible for negotiating an appropriate length of time required on the agenda and to determine whether they have sufficient time to prepare for the meeting.
- Timed limitations on agenda items.

Irwin Nayer, MCAC Vice-Chair commented that it would be more efficient if Members reviewed the meeting agenda in advance of the meetings to ensure they are prepared to comment.

3. 2015 Tour de Mississauga

Dorothy Tomiuk, Citizen Member provided a verbal update regarding the Tour de Mississauga. She discussed the update to the CCR system and the hope to have the system functional in time for the Applewood Community Ride. Ms. Tomiuk reviewed the Tour de Mississauga sponsors, the work list, the new Transitway route, and advised that a separate informal meeting would take place to discuss the Tour route. Ms. Tomiuk further commented that the sell-off of 2014 Tour de Mississauga jerseys was subject to Council's approval on June 10, 2015, that she was working on the design of the 2015 jersey, t-shirt and a web site update.

Joanne deCloe, Citizen Member, noted that volunteer recruitment was underway as the volunteer hours for assisting at the Tour de Mississauga was listed on the volunteer opportunities boards at Mississauga high schools

4. 2016 Tour de Mississauga

Greg Symons, Citizen Member and Ben Gomberg, Manager, Active Transportation led a discussion with respect to Council's request for a third-party operator model for the 2016 Tour de Mississauga and a business plan to implement the request.

Mr. Symons explained that the third-party model would involve a community-based, separate organization that would champion the Tour de Mississauga and the current Community Rides as a non-profit affiliate group that would work with the City of Mississauga but operate independently.

Mr. Gomberg suggested that the group call themselves, "Bike Mississauga" and adopt it as their own entity as a not-for-profit community association of citizens. Mr. Gomberg further noted that the group should be welcoming of cyclists of all abilities in Mississauga.

Jaqueline Hunter, Active Transportation Technologist suggested that some preliminary research and benchmarking could be done with other similar community organizations and shared with the Committee at the next MCAC meeting, to which the Committee agreed.

Mr. Gomberg suggested that a staff person from the Community Services Department who is experienced in establishing and supporting affiliate groups could attend the July 14, 2015 MCAC meeting to provide information to the Committee, to which the Committee agreed. Mr. Gomberg and Mr. Symons requested that any questions that the

MCAC Members had regarding the formation of a non-profit group be forwarded to them via email.

RECOMMENDATION

- That the Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee review third party models for Tour de Mississauga including other bike and cycling clubs and organizations and provide input to Greg Symons, Citizen Member and Ben Gomberg, Manager, Active Transportation;

5. 2015 Community Rides

Members of the Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee (MCAC) reviewed and amended the 2015 Community Rides Schedule.

Ms. Tomiuk noted the success and large turn-out for two Community Rides in Ward 10 with 148 participants on the first ride and 108 participants on the second ride, including the Councillor and twenty to thirty first time riders. Ms. Tomiuk further commented that she had not heard of any complaints or accidents on the ride.

Discussion amongst the Members ensued regarding the possibility of selecting hybrid routes on future rides that would include both paved and unpaved portions of the route and the benefits of dividing the riders into three groups so that they are riding with similarly skilled evelists.

Ms. Formiuk requested that Members attend their scheduled rides and issue regrets if they are not able to attend. Mr. Nayer noted that it is also essential for MCAC Members to be familiar with the route that they are leading residents on and that they should be working together as a team.

Roy Buchanan, Citizen Member commented that he had brought a set of walkie-talkies on the ride and that it was extremely helpful in communicating with his MCAC ride partner. Discussion ensued amongst the Members with regard to communication, promoting safety, and a consensus that the purchase of additional walkie-talkie sets is recommended for use on the Community Rides.

RECOMMENDATION

That Roy Buchanan, Citizen Member be authorized to purchase three (3) sets of walkie-talkies to promote safety and communication on Community Rides, not exceeding \$300.00.

6. Communications and Promotions Subcommittee

Barbara Hazel Tabuno, Citizen Member presented the draft Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee 2015 Work Plan for consideration by the Committee.

Discussion ensued with respect to the dollar amounts assigned to various individual work plan items and clarification was sought with respect to the significance of the dollar amounts and whether they represented a request for funding or were an actual budgetary item. Mr. Morris commented that the dollar amounts were actual amounts and should provide a starting point for the 2015 work plan.

Mr. Gomberg advised that there was a need to provide a separate summary of where the funds were being obtained. Discussion ensued regarding a demonstrated need for funding and the ability to demonstrate fiscal responsibility. Members were in agreement that the work plan and associated dollar figures needed further evaluation and that their findings should be documented and forwarded to Members of the Communications and Promotions Subcommittee.

7. Network and Technical Subcommittee

Donnie Morris, MCAC Chair provided a verbal update regarding the Network and Technical Subcommittee's work. Mr. Morris noted the need for clear signage, additional painting, and centre line painting on roads and an upgrade from signed routes to sharrows. Mr. Morris further commented that they would be routing 30 km and 60 km rides and incorporating the Transitway bus route. Mr. Morris advised that he and Don Patterson, Citizen Member had met with Councillor Mahoney (Ward 8) to show Councillor Mahoney the bike map of Ward 8 and that the Councillor had attended a Community Ride following the meeting. Mr. Morris further advised that he would be meeting with Councillor Kovac (Ward 4) the following week to encourage the Councillors to be ambassadors for cycling

Mr. Gomberg congratulated the Network and Technical Subcommittee for making connections with City Councillors and suggested that in future it would be helpful to have a staff person present at these meetings to provide staff perspective and input.

An inquiry with respect to the ride scheduled for July 11, 2015 arose and Councillor Fonseca advised that she had purchased fifty (50) tickets to the Pan Am Games for the July 11, 2015 ride and noted that the ride would start at Celebration Square and finish at Hershey SportZone to view Pan Am Games events. Councillor Fonseca further noted that if the July 11, 2015 ride went well, the Committee could consider doing an additional Pan Am Ride in August.

8. Joint Cycling Committees of Western Lake Ontario

Irwin Nayer, MCAC Vice-Chair provided a verbal update regarding the Joint Cycling Committees of Western Lake Ontario meeting noting that several Municipalities were present at the meeting and that each Municipality had the opportunity to share information about their Cycling Committees. Mr. Nayer commented that the City of Hamilton had started a very impressive bike-share program and provided some statistical data with respect to the program.

Mr. Nayer commented on a collective plan to encourage Municipal Councils to include safety and cycling in school curriculums at a future meeting of the Joint Cycling Committees of Western Lake Ontario, which would now be meeting twice per year, in March and October.

1.29 Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee

Mr. Nayer distributed a communications postcard created jointly by Share The Road and the Town of Grimsby and noted that Share The Road had created the piece and that the Town of Grimsby had personalized and paid for it.

Jonathan Giggs, Citizen Member inquired whether the Joint Cycling Committees of Western Lake Ontario meetings were public and open for everyone to attend and was advised that they are by invitation only. Mr. Nayer commented that Ben Gomberg, Manager, Active Transportation may find attending these meetings beneficial.

These locations have been selected based on the criteria contained within the 2010 Cycling Master Plan and Implementation Strategy and in coordination with other City of Mississauga and/or Region of Peel Capital projects. The nature and schedule of the proposed projects listed herein are subject to change in accordance with budget, public consultation and Council approval.

Altogether, 26.2 kilometres of cycling infrastructure is proposed to be constructed in 2015.
