1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

The Chair called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. DECLARATIONS OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The Chair declared a conflict of interest with respect to Tilda Rice with whom he facilitated a sponsorship for the sale of Tilda Rice in the Museums Gift Shop for which he was compensated.

6. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING</u>

With respect to Item 10(a) Collections Policy Communications Plan, the Chair clarified that there is not sufficient information to raise awareness of the Committee's Role in the Executive Summary. Ms. A. Hagan, Museums and Traditions Manager, advised that there are more details in the Plan than contained in the Executive Summary.

The minutes of the Museums of Mississauga Advisory Committee (MOMAC) meeting held on November 25, 2013 were approved as amended.

7. MATTERS TO BE CONSIDERED

(a) <u>Update on Terms of Reference Task Group</u>

The Chair noted that due to the unavailability of several members away on vacation, a meeting has not convened of the Task Group, but that one will be convened prior to the next MOMAC Meeting.

(b) MOMAC 2014 Work Plan

The Chair advised that he has developed a MOMAC work plan for the last year of the Committee's term. The priority areas for the Committee's focus are Artifact Collection and a City Wide Museum. He noted that the Artifact Collection priorities include proactive communication to raise awareness in the community that the Museums of Mississauga are collecting against a specific mandate, and to proactively engage with citizens and collectors

regarding potential for donations and acquisitions. The City-wide Museum priorities include an Advocacy Program, formulating a Vision for the new city-wide museum, work with City staff in evaluation of any potential sites and advise as required, and to champion a "Museum Design".

The Committee commented as follows:

- Collection will not be limited to, but will focus on 1939 and onwards;
- Utilize newsletters from Members of Council to their respective residents:
- Engage the public through information meetings such as an Annual General Meeting;
- Connecting with estate planners, lawyers and financial planners with Mississauga Community Foundation for endowments.

Councillor Tovey advised that the Inspiration Lakeview Master Plan has recommended a Museum facility on the Ontario Power Generation site along with an art gallery. The Chair advised that he would be attending the public meeting on the Inspiration Lakeview Master Plan on March 18, 2014.

Museums of Mississauga Report – March to May 2014

Below are highlights of note, activities and events held at the Museums, an update on Capital Projects, and the Collections and Exhibits Report for the period March 16 to May 31, 2014.

HIGHLIGHTS OF NOTE:

- The Museums received summer grant funding from two Federal programs. The Summer Experience Program subsidizes the costs of two summer Day Camp Leaders. The Young Canada Works in Heritage program is covering 75% of the cost of a Collections Assistant who is helping with the Collections Database.
- Friends of the Museums of Mississauga received an \$8,200 grant from the Hazel McCallion Foundation for Arts, Culture and Heritage, which is held by the Community Foundation of Mississauga. The funds are for the Doors Open/Culture Days WWI historical re-enactment and flyover of replica WWI planes from the Great Warplane Heritage Museum September 27-28. Benares is also hosting a WWI education day for 400 grade ten students on September 29, funded by SUNCOR and Friends of the Museums of Mississauga.

Museums of Mississauga Report – March to May 2014

MONTH	HIGHLIGHTS
March 2014	 Busy Maple month, with 19 maple school visits and the Maple Magic event. 3,129 people attended and visitor evaluations showed it was a successful event. Numbers were down with one day cancelled due to a snow storm and extreme cold on several other days. Moving admission to the front had a very positive impact on revenues generated; this proved our suspicion that many people had previously not gone to the Anchorage to pay. Event sponsorship was received from the Port Credit Community Foundation, Holcim Canada, and Friends of the Museums of Mississauga. Visual Arts programming included four March Break day camps at Community Centres, with 49 students. In March, we began a series of Two-Way Communications meetings with the Museums part-time staff team, which consists of 12 Museum Interpreters and 4 Special Events Assistants. The group nominated three part-time staff to be a part of a Museums Working Group, along with Museums management, to develop a plan to improve communication and to better engage the front line staff in the Museums' operations. The Working Group has been very productive and positive, and is meeting every three weeks. They will be reporting back with a Work Plan for implementation at the end of October.
April 2014	 Museums of Mississauga organized "Tour of 905 West: Innovation and Re-invention in Action" on April 7th as part of Canadian Museum Association's Annual Conference. 25 participants from across Canada participated in sessions at Art Gallery of Mississauga and Peel Art Gallery, Museum and Archives. Andrew Whittemore, Acting Director Culture and Annemarie Hagan, Manager Museums and Traditions both did presentations. The Museums hosted two volunteer teas to celebrate 'National Volunteer Appreciation Week', one at Leslie Log House on April 9 and one at Benares Visitor Centre on April 12. 5 Museums of Mississauga volunteers received a Provincial Volunteer Award at the end of April. Each has volunteered for five to twenty years. Spring Visual Arts Programming included 13 Youth classes with 142 students and 4 Adult Classes with 28 students. On April 29 the Museums hosted a meeting with 5 representatives of MIRANET, Andrew Whittemore, Acting Director, Culture, Paul Damaso, Manager, Culture Operations, Annemarie Hagan, Manager, Museums and Traditions and Jeremy Harvey, Chair of MOMAC. It was a very positive meeting, focussing on Museums operations and ideas for promoting and marketing the sites. MIRANET has been very helpful in ongoing promotion to residents across the City.

May 2014

- Second year for Benares Mother's Day High Tea, served in the dining and sitting rooms of historic house, with 1920s fashion show. Sold out three sittings, with 108 participants. Plan to expand number of sittings next year.
- Two **Community Living volunteers** started weekly volunteering at Bradley Museum, helping with sweeping paths, watering, etc.
- On May 16, two busloads of students from Clifton Public School participated in an all-day program at Bradley Museum this was a return visit. One of the grade three students told the Museum Interpreters: "I was so excited to come to Bradley Museum, I woke up at 6 am and I couldn't go back to sleep!" See Page 8 of this report for more visitor evaluation comments.
- Commemorative 40th Anniversary Mississauga City Council meeting held at Burnhamthorpe Theatre on May 21. Annemarie Hagan, Manager, Museums and Traditions, Becky Ryder, Chair of Friends of the Museums and Jeremy Harvey, Chair of MOMAC all made presentations. Mississauga Transit's 40th anniversary bus wrap unveiled with photo op with Council. The bus includes graphics from the Museums' exhibit and the www.40years40sagas.com exhibit website on the back of the bus. The City's Communications division also launched a "Storify" campaign to encourage residents to share their images and stories. It is linked into the exhibit website.
- The City of Mississauga 1974-2014: 40 Years, 40 Sagas exhibit celebrating the 40th anniversary of the City of Mississauga has travelled to a number of venues including Malton Community Centre, Frank McKechnie Community Centre and Carrassauga. It is scheduled for the remainder of 2014 and will include the Bread & Honey Festival in Streetsville, Benares Visitor Centre, Clarkson Community Centre, Peel Archives, Museum and Art Gallery (PAMA) and the Meadowvale Theatre. www.40years40sagas.com. From March to May the site had 690 sessions with 513 users and 3,185 page views. 74% were new users (Google Analytics). #sauga40, #40years40sagas
- On May 22, 15 employee volunteers from Holcim (Canada)
 Inc. assisted in gardening, carpentry and clean up chores at the
 Bradley Museum site.
- Streetsville Horticultural Society, who care for the gardens at Leslie Log House, held their annual plant sale at Leslie on May 24 for the first time. Very successful.
- A total of 1,663 volunteer hours have been completed so far this year.

Coming Up

- Starting in July, Museums staff will work with other Culture
 Division staff on the development of a Marketing Plan for
 implementation. It is expected that this will include plans for
 launching social media sites for the Museums, in addition to the
 Culture Division social media. In the meantime, we are making
 use of the Friends of the Museums Twitter for promotion.
- Friends of the Museums' On the Verandah Summer Concert Series is underway, 7:30 pm every Friday night to end of August.

- Friends of the Museums of Mississauga's Bayer's Stewardship Garden launched at Bradley Museum on June 11th. It had been planned for Benares, however soil testing showed that the soil, although fine for residential gardens, did not meet the Agricultural Standards required for donating the produce to a food bank. Heritage varieties will be grown to ensure garden fits with historic interpretation of the site.
- June is busy with: 12 schools coming for Play Day Fun, Early Settler and Simple Machine Programs; tour by a United Empire Loyalists' group; sold out Downton Abbey Tea with 40 visitors on June 1.
- Summer Day Camps at the Museums include: Bradley Mash Up (heritage, drama, hiking); Guitar Mania; The Young Artist; Visual Arts and Teen Visual Arts; Arts Express; Nature Explorations; Benares Blasters (Sports); and Mini Soccer.
- On June 14, 150 to 200 local Citi-Group employees and their families are having a Volunteer Day at Bradley Museum,
 organized in partnership with Mississauga Parks and Forestry and Environmental Divisions.
- Ten school and summer day camp outreach programs are scheduled.
- Driftwood Theatre's "The Tempest" at Bradley Museum July 19 and Leslie Log House August 15.
- Strawberry Garden Party at Benares on Sunday, June 22.
 Teddy Bears' Picnic at Benares, Sunday, July 27.
- Plans are well underway for Doors Open Mississauga and Culture Days, the weekend of September 27-28.



CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

SITE	DETAILS
Facility and Property Maintenance (FPM) Capital Projects at Bradley	 BRADLEY BARN: re-cladded in reclaimed barn boards, gaps and holes filled, French drain added to improve drainage and prevent future water damage to the structure. BRADLEY WOODSHED: all damaged siding boards removed and replaced with reclaimed wood. BRADLEY HOUSE: main floor window that was shattered by vandals last year has now been repaired. Delays caused by need for custom ordering shatter-resistant glass for historic window as well as the fact that the installation cannot happen when the temperature is below freezing.
Facility and Property Maintenance (FPM) Capital Projects at Benares	 Benares Historic House was closed for tours from February 25 to April 27 to allow for the restoration of the original floors on the main floor. Larger artifacts were moved to Armstrong Fine Art Storage for the duration of the work. Interior floors on ground floor were restored (main hallway with painted pattern) or refinished (inside rooms). The basement stairs and floors were also repainted. The project included new wallpaper in the sitting room. There is a chance that we may be able to also get the wallpaper in the drawing room and hallway also replaced as part of the project. POTTING SHED: floors removed and repaired/replaced (safety issue). DAIRY: will be replacing the siding and the roof. Awaiting delivery of fire-rated cedar shingles, which are expected to arrive mid-July. BAKE OVEN: bricks repointed last summer, but still leaks smoke from the roof. Roof will be replaced at the same time as the Dairy roof is done in July. It is expected that then the Bake Oven will then once again be usable in programming. Michael Spazianni Architects were hired for both the Benares and Bradley Projects. All Benares work approved by Ontario Heritage Trust under the terms of City of Mississauga's Heritage Easement with OHT.

Collections & Exhibit Highlights March 1st to May31st

- Preparing for artifact move to Armstrong Fine Arts Services in August including creating a master list and completing condition reports.
- Working with Internal Audit to improve our procedures for Collections Management. This
 included meeting with the Manager of Risk Management to discuss the procedure for
 recording our artifact collection. A report detailing all artifacts valued at \$2500 or more was
 compiled and sent to Risk Management.
- Various outreach exhibits have been installed including a display about fashion accessories at Council Reception, May is Museum Month at Central Library, History of the Credit Valley Rotary Club at the Port Credit Arena and promotional displays at Courtney Park Library and Malton Library.
- Key acquisitions include Scouts Canada Hat that belonged to Bruce Woolton, Bradley Pioneer Recipe Book, Centennial & Expo items including an ashtray, tea tin, decal, buttons, bag and pins. We purchased some City Souvenirs with the old logo including a golf shirt, Frisbees, paper opener, leather book mark and pins. Arlene Chatfield donated a doll carriage and two dolls from 1936 with original receipt. A large collection of framed photographs, plaques and awards were transferred from the Corporate Art Collection including two formal portraits of Mayor Dobkin and Mayor Searle, certificate from Recycling Council of Ontario (1988), framed photograph of opening of Civic Centre with the Mayor and the Duke & Duchess of York and various City Council photographs.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the report from the Commissioner of Community Services titled "Update on the Benares Fund – Fiscal Year 2013" dated June 2, 2014,

be received for information.

BACKGROUND:

The "Benares Funds" is an umbrella term that includes the funds held in the Benares Endowment Reserve Fund in the City of Mississauga Miscellaneous Reserve Fund and in the Benares Museum Fund at the Community Foundation of Mississauga. The total value of the Benares Funds is determined by adding together the amounts in these

two funds.

Any expenditures must be demonstrably utilized "for the purposes of Benares" as indicated by John Henry Cox's will and the related legal agreements between the City of Mississauga, the Ontario Heritage

Trust and the Community Foundation of Mississauga.

As per their terms of Reference, the Museums of Mississauga Advisory Committee (MOMAC) is responsible for advising Mississauga City Council on any issues relating to the Benares

Endowment Fund.

At their June 21, 2010 meeting, MOMAC adopted formalized principles for managing the Benares Fund as outlined in the corporate report entitled "Formalization of the Principles of the Management of the Benares Fund" (MOMAC 0010-2010 and GC 0518-2010). In that document it is stated that: "The intention is that the original capital amount of \$102,000 (December 2002) will not be diminished except under extraordinary circumstances."

COMMENTS:

Over the years, MOMAC has endorsed funding for four projects from the Benares Funds, with a total value of \$57,650:

- Benares Audio-Visual Project (\$28,500);
- Benares Historic House Picnic Tables (\$3,150);
- Benares Historic House Summer Kitchen Renovation Project (\$20,000);
- Benares Conservation and Preservation of an Artifact Project (Mary Harris Wedding Dress) (\$5,100).

The balance as of December 31st, 2012 was \$127,448.30.

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
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

Gallery just too small, AGM officials say

MISSISSAUGA — It's time for Canada's smallest public art gallery to expand.

Stuart Keeler, director and curator of the Art Gallery of Mississauga, appeared at General Committee yesterday to say that, at just 2,000 sq.-ft., the AGM is simply too small to serve the country's sixth largest city. He was joined by AGM board chair Mike Douglas and the two implored councillors to help them find a larger space.

Two options were suggested. Both would keep the gallery in the city's burgeoning downtown core.

The first was to expand the gallery, which is located in City Hall. The other was to look at finding a new home at the neighbouring Living Arts Centre.

The idea of finding a larger location for the gallery has been bandied about for years. Many have said it needs to have its own stand-alone home in the downtown area and some councillors yesterday suggested trying to find a space that both the gallery and a proposed museum could share.

Interest in the gallery continues to grow despite its physical limitations, said Keeler. In 2011, just under 19,000 people visited the gallery and in 2012 it had more than 26,000 visitors. Last year, more than 30,000 walked through the gallery doors.

Keeler said audience numbers are expected to continue to trend upwards and, within a few years, could be anywhere between 60,000 and 90,000 visitors a year.

There's a variety of reasons for the growth, said Keeler, including relevant and interesting exhibitions, new marketing strategies and the strong support of the board of directors and staff.

"We've simply outgrown our space," said Keeler.

He said lack of space is hurting the gallery's collection, as a pair of Mississauga art patrons with pieces from the Group of Seven and Norval Morrisseau sent their art to other galleries outside of the city because the AGM didn't have the space for them. He said there are a number of art lovers in Mississauga with stunning collections who would prefer to keep them local but can't, due to lack of space.

Councillors were very supportive of the request and asked staff to examine the feasibility of the gallery's request.

"What we have there right now is (not enough), there's no doubt about it," said Ward 4 councillor Frank Dale. "I think we should take a good look at the feasibility of expansion or moving it to the LAC. There's no question we need an art gallery that's appropriate for the size of our city."

Keeler said, with more room, they could show their collection without having to take breaks, while also providing a community meeting space and a community gallery for residents to stage their own exhibits.

Ward 7 Councillor Nando Iannicca said the municipality must be bold when it comes to arts and culture and the role they play in city building.

"It's no longer time for the faint of heart, it's time to build a city that North America will be talking about," said Iannicca, adding arts and culture play major roles in all the world's greatest cities.
