

Good morning Ms. Melo,

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
I am writing to inquire about the possibility of having a crossing guard at the intersection of Mineola Road and Woodland Avenue. It is an intersection with a three way stop. I find this intersection to be an unpredictable intersection when crossing. I would be very nervous about letting my children cross there alone and I've spoken to other parents about it and have heard the same. The reason I say it's unpredictable is because cars often fail to stop at all, or stop and then just start going again even though there are people waiting to cross the street. I have even been half way across the intersection when a car swerved around me and my two children and turned onto Woodland Avenue.

A specific incident happened on the morning of Thursday, April 9th. On that morning I witnessed a silver minivan repeatedly fail to stop for a young child. The child was on the east side of Woodland Avenue, attempting to cross Mineola Road. A silver minivan traveling east along Mineola Road had stopped at the stop sign. The child began to cross the road and the van began entering the intersection. The child stopped and the van stopped. The child once again attempted to cross the road and the van began to proceed into the intersection again. Once again, both stopped. Then the van entered the intersection and continued east along Mineola Road. It was abundantly clear that the child was trying to cross the road but the driver would not let the child cross.



Hi, I am writing about the dangerous traffic situation around Willow glen public school, specifically the intersection of Lewisham and Brookhurst. Their is a busy pedestrian entrance into the school at this intersection. While there is clear signage banning parking here, it is routinely ignored. Drivers park blocking driveways and the entrance into the school and than often will do a 3 point turn in the middle of the intersection to turn around. This makes it even more dangerous as a pedestrian with 2 kids and ströller trying to cross this street. I have been witnessing this daily since January when I walk my son to and from school. (with many parents) Some days are worse than others. I have NEVER seen ANY parking authority or police presence here despite this very hazardous crossing. There are crossing guards at Lewisham and Truscott where there is a traffic light, but nothing here at this intersection. I've seen a few "near misses" at this site, but today there was an accident where apparently a car was rear ended. This accident has prompted me to write, I should have written sooner.

I would highly recommend some traffic enforcement in this area before there is a serious injury involving a child. And possibly consider reinstating a crossing guard. It is my understanding there was a guard here years ago.





Report OTC Conference May 3rd-5th 2015 Sault Ste. Marie

Attended by: Sandra Benuik, Mashkoor Sherwani & Louise Goegan

Session 1: Discussion was on the latest projects by the MTO including monies spent in the last year and plans for future years. They talked about revamping book 12 A which deals with bicycle lanes, signals and safety. This revamp is due to be released in the fall of 2015 along with adjustments to book 15 which deals with pedestrian safety. Statistics given by the speaker included the following.

- 1. A person is killed on Ontario roads every 18 hours
- 2. A person is injured on Ontario roads every 8.5 minutes
- 3. There is a collision every 3 minutes on Ontario roads.
- 4. 21 Billion dollars has been spent on infrastructure from 2011-2014.

Session 2: We had speakers from Brampton and Ottawa taking on the debate of allowing municipalities to determine whether speed limits within their communities should be lowered from 50 km/hour to 40 km/hour. Ottawa agreed and Brampton disagreed. Both presented their cases and a vote was taken after of the participants. Most agreed that the speed should stay the same. This is under review by the MTO and they will determine the outcome later this year.

Session 3: Road Diet Project in Sault Ste. Marie, A road diet is where a 4 lane road is reduced to a two lane with a centre turning lane and two bike lanes on either side. What are the advantages or disadvantages?

Advantages:

- 1. Reduces number of lanes pedestrian would cross
- 2. Improves safety for cyclists
- 3. Reduces rear end collisions
- 4. Increases speed limits being observed
- 5. Reduces severity of crashes.

Disadvantages:

- 1. Reduces road capacity
- 2. Reduction of street parking
- 3. Confusion during implementation
- 4. Impacts vehicles that require frequent stops such as buses, garbage trucks, act.

It was determined that both sides of argument needed to be looked at before making a decision to do this. Resident input is essential.

Session 4: Balancing between Traffic calming and Emergency Response time. When municipalities put in traffic calming measures this can impact the time for emergency vehicles to respond. When seconds count in a person's life this can be crucial. There are several types of calming measures that can be put

in place which would prevent the big fire trucks from turning a corner. Speed bumps would also cause vehicles to slow down. Studies were done and it was determined that most not all calming measures would cause a delay of about 10 seconds. This study recommended that the following be done prior to using calming devices:

- 1. Consult with EMS before installing any calming measures
- 2. Determine which type of calming measure you want to install
- 3. Document with facts on delay times.

Session 5: Preparation for Pan Am and Para Pan in the Town of Milton.

Presenters showed the work that they have been involved in during the last year and a half to accommodate these games. With several Regional roads and arterial roads being affected these games are going to impact two golf courses, a garden centre, Region of Haltom's landfill centre as well as numerous residents in the area. Once the security sweep is done no one can enter or leave the zone without proper clearance. Accommodations for getting both the athletes and spectators in and out as well as parking considerations have to be planned for. It is incredible the amount of planning and disruption just this one venue will cause.

<u>Session 6:</u> Connecting the North to Southern Ontario's Growing Bike Tourism. This presenter was very passionate about her subject. She out lined plans that are underway to develop a bike network between the Sault and Sudbury. It is the hope that bike trails will go completely across the Province linking in to the Trans Canada Trail at various points and keeping close to the water of the Great Lakes. Biking has become a growing part of our tourism industry in Ontario. It is important to note that all this work is being done by non-profit and volunteers.



Session 7: Technical Tour of Sault St. Marie's HUB trail system.

We boarded a bus and were taken on a tour of the HUB trail system that runs around the city. We stopped at a few locations and this picture was taken on one of the bridges that has been installed to

take the trail over ravines. This 20 km non-motorized, multi-use trail circles the city and incorporates urban areas, rivers, wildflowers, meadows, waterfalls hills and scenic vistas. Very enjoyable tour.

Session 8: Efficient Transportation Networks: A multi-modal perspective.

This session was based on a lot of engineering technicalities and it showed by graphs how by changing one portion of a route it could directly impact on another area.

Session 9: New Cycling Design Guidelines: The OTM Book 18 is intended to provide practical guidelines on planning, designing, and implementing cycling facilities within municipal road right of ways. It has to be recognized that the higher the speed, higher the volume there has to be greater separation. All factors have to be considered when selecting the facility type. Below are some of those types:

- 1. Paved shoulder: signed bike route, paved shoulder with optional hatching
- 2. Bicycle lanes with solid lines right to intersection
- 3. Separated bike lanes with either flex bollards, planters, raised cycle tracks.

There was discussion around snow removal in winter and that with the growing popularity of bicycling that this is no longer an option. Ways to remove the snow for bikes has to be implemented.

Session 10: Showcase using Benefit- Cost Analysis to enhance Decision Making process over Road improvements. This again was a very technical presentation which gave points or values to different aspects such as time delay, emissions etc. and based on the total of points it would determine the priority of the project.

On the Monday night we were taken to the Bush Plane Museum for dinner and a tour. Very interesting and overall the conference was very informative. We wish to take this opportunity to thank MTS Committee for providing us with this opportunity.
