# 2. <u>Site Inspection Report - Barondale Public School & San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School (Ward 5)</u>

### MATTERS CONSIDERED

1. Approval of March 27, 2013 Minutes

Minutes of the Traffic Safety Council meeting held on March 27, 2013.

2. <u>Site Inspection Report - Barondale Public School & San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School (Ward 5)</u>

Site Inspection report for the inspection conducted on March 28, 2013 to review safety at the intersection of Kennedy Road and Wilderness Trail/Grand Highland Way for the students attending Barondale Public School and San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School.

David Brown, Chair spoke to the site inspection and explained that the students at both schools are still on the bus and at this time Traffic Safety Council cannot determine if a crossing guard should be in place at the intersection on a permanent basis. He further explained that there would be additional site inspections in September 2013 when the bussing is removed to determine if a guard is warranted.

Iwona Stasiewicz, resident and Chan Lee, resident asked questions of the Committee with respect to the site inspection, criteria for placing a guard and traffic patterns. Mr. Brown and Sheelagh Duffin, Crossing Guard Supervisor explained the site inspection process and the criteria to warrant a crossing guard at the intersection. Mr. Brown explained that if there are changes to the traffic patterns in the area and a site inspection request has been received, Traffic Safety Council would re-inspect the intersection. Further discussion ensued with respect to the timing of the pedestrian signals and traffic congestion in the area for crossing students.

### RECOMMENDATION

1. That a crossing guard be installed at the intersection of Kennedy Road and Grand Highland Way/Wilderness Trail in September 2013 at the beginning of the school year when bussing is to be removed for 194 students in kindergarten to grade 8 residing east of Kennedy Road on a temporary basis as a proactive measure as the traffic warrants have been met for the students attending Barondale Public School and San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School.

- 2. That the Site Inspection Subcommittee of Traffic Safety Council be requested to conduct two (2) site inspections at the intersection of Kennedy Road and Grand Highland Way/Wilderness Trail in September 2013 to determine if sufficient student pedestrians are crossing the intersection to meet the pedestrian warrants for retention of the crossing guard.
- That Transportation and Works be requested to paint zebra stripes around the intersection of Kennedy Road and Grand Highland Way/Wilderness Trail and ensure that the traffic control signals are set at slow walking speed crossing Kennedy Road.
- 4. That Traffic Safety Council notify the principals at Barondale Public School and San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School that the subject crossing guard is being placed at the intersection of Kennedy Road and Grand Highland Way/Wilderness Trail on a trial basis and that should the warrants for the crossing guard not be met at the site inspections conducted in September 2013, Traffic Safety Council may recommend that the crossing guard be removed and further Traffic Safety Council will request that the principals notify the parents of the decision of Traffic Safety Council.

3. Site Inspection Report – St. Pio of Pietrelcina Catholic School (Ward 4)

Site Inspection Report for the inspection conducted on April 2, 2013 to review safety at the intersection of Central Parkway East and Bud Gregory Boulevard for the students attending St. Pio of Pietrelcina Catholic School.

Councillor Dale requested that another site inspection be scheduled at the location in May 2013 to compare with the results in September 2013. He expressed concern with the removal of bussing for the students at the school. Ms. Abbruscato noted that she did not agree with the rationale by Student Transportation of Peel Region to remove the bussing. Councillor Dale requested that Transportation and Works staff review the feasibility of installing a countdown timer at the subject intersection.

### RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Site Inspection Subcommittee of Traffic Safety Council re-inspect the intersection of Central Parkway East and Bud Gregory Boulevard for the students attending St. Pio of Pietrelcina Catholic School in May 2013 and in September 2013 when bussing is removed as turning traffic is light and the traffic control signals provide protection for crossing pedestrians.

2. That Transportation and Works be requested to review the feasibility of a countdown timer at the intersection of Central Parkway East and Bud Gregory Boulevard and report back to Traffic Safety Council.

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

The east driveway through the school grounds is a One Way drive to assist parents using to drop off or pick up, neither K & R ,bus lane or driving lanes marked on pavement.

With minor pavement painting defining driving lanes on both lots, all of the concerns noted would be resolved.

There is more than sufficient Parking for all events at this site except perhaps for a Justin Beiber concert.

### Recommendations:

- 1.That TSC representatives & Peel Maintenance Manager review this school's driveway layout and pavement marking deficiencies at their June 11th., meeting including utilizing area to the east of school which sits barren.
- 2. The The Valley's Sr Public School be placed on the current Peel Bd. painting program to define K & R location, exclusive Bus lane storage, pedestrian cross walk hatching and one way driving lanes
- 3. That the broken swing gate at the end of the front parking lot be refitted

- ii. That by no later than the start of the next term of Council, items that wholly occur on school board property, specifically Dismissal Reports and Kiss and Ride Reports, be transferred to school board officials to manage.
- iii. That by no later than the start of the next term of Council, the Engineering and Works division be transferred the duty from the Clerk's Office for both inspection(s) scheduling and creating the inspection reports from the field data collected.
- iv. That during the next term of Council, staff be directed to analyze opportunities for the work of the Traffic Safety Council to be handled by City staff, and report back to the Governance Committee with this analysis.

# TRAFFIC SAFETY COUNCIL TERMS OF REFERENCE

### **MANDATE**

The Mississauga Traffic Safety Council considers matters related to the safety of students and their movement through the City of Mississauga and shall, wherever the situation warrants it, make particular recommendations to the Council of the City of Mississauga which are designed and intended to protect elementary and secondary school students from the dangers of vehicular traffic or related hazards and will work in cooperation with other Committees of Council on issues regarding pedestrian safety throughout the City of Mississauga.

### **OPERATION**

The Mississauga Traffic Safety Council shall operate according to the Procedural By-law regulating the operation of meetings of Council and its Committees. Appointed members are required to attend site inspections on a regular basis to review requests for Crossing Guards, to review safety concerns in school areas and the implementation or review of the School Zone Safety (Kiss & Ride) Program. For the purpose of site inspections, the City will be divided into two (2) zones (North and South) with the boundary being Eglinton Avenue.

### **TERM OF OFFICE**

- 1. The Term of Office of the members appointed to the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council shall run concurrent with the term of Council, or until successors are appointed.
- 2. At the first meeting of the new term of the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council, the members will appoint from among their number, a Chair and Vice-Chair.
- 3. Members of Subcommittees will be appointed at the first meeting of the Traffic Safety Council in January of the new term.



### QUORUM

- A quorum of the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council shall result from the presence of a majority of the appointed members, at a time no later than thirty (30) minutes past the time for which the meeting was scheduled and so noted on the agenda or notice of the meeting.
- 2. The presence of one (1) of the appointed Councillors shall be required to make quorum.

### COMPOSITION

The membership of the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council will be appointed by Resolution of Council and comprise the following and will vote on matters brought before the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council:

- 3 Councillors
- 2 Trustees (1 from the Peel District School Board and 1 from the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board)
- Up to 2 Members for Life

**Enforcement Division** 

- 11 Citizens (Representing the eleven (11) wards in the City)
- 3 Citizens (Representing the City at large (2 appointed to the North Zone and 1 appointed to the South Zone)

### **Advisory Board**

The membership of the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council Advisory Board, comprised of the following, will not require appointment by Council Resolution and will not vote on matters brought before the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council:

Manager of Student Transportation (or Designate), Peel District School Board/Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board Principals'/Vice-Principals' Association (1 from the Peel District School Board and 1 from the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board) Transportation & Works (Traffic Operations) staff Transportation & Works (Crossing Guard Supervisor) Manager of Parking Control (or Designate), Transportation and Works,

## **Advisory Board (cont'd)**

The following representation from Mississauga staff and local agencies will not require appointment by Council Resolution and will not be required to attend meetings unless there is a matter of interest on the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council agenda that requires their attendance at the meeting. Attendance at meetings will be determined by the Chair of the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council or by the representative:

Peel Regional Police, Traffic Services Projects Coordinator, Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board Maintenance Services, Peel District School Board City of Mississauga Planning and Building staff

### LIFE MEMBER CRITERIA

Where the Traffic Safety Council reviews or considers a member for appointment as a Member for Life, the Traffic Safety Council will consider a member's contributions in the following areas:

- 1. Subcommittees:
  - a. Public Information Subcommittee
  - b. Budget Subcommittee
  - c. Site Plan Review Subcommittee
  - d. Walk to School Sub-committee
  - e. Ad-hoc committees
- 2. Site Inspection Subcommittee Participation
- 3. Kiss & Ride Program Participation
- 4. Dismissal Program Participation
- 5. Special Projects



### **SUBCOMMITTEES**

The Mississauga Traffic Safety Council may establish subcommittees, from time to time, to deal with specific issues. These subcommittees may include Public Information, Peel Safe & Active Routes to Schools, Site Plan Review, Budget Review and any other subcommittees as required; the subcommittees make recommendations to Traffic Safety Council; quorum does not include the attendance of a Councillor; all members of the subcommittees, including staff, have the right to vote; the Chair of the subcommittees will be appointed on a yearly basis.

The City Clerk or his/her designate will assign duties as Secretary to the Mississauga Traffic Safety Council.
