- The 2011 Census showed Canada's population at 33,476,688 persons which amounted to an increase of 1,863,791 persons (5.9%) since the 2006 census. Canada's 2006 population was 31,612,897.
- In 2011, nearly 23.1 million people, or more than seven-tenths of Canadians, were living in census metropolitan area.
- Ontario's 2011 population of 12,851,821, is an increase of more than 690,000 more than the 12,160,282 reported in 2006 for a 5.7% increase.
- The Toronto Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) with a population of 5,113,149 in 2006 grew 9.2% to 5,583,064 in 2011.
- Mississauga; Canada's 6th largest city; had a population increase of 6.7% from 2006 to 2011. Mississauga's 2011 population of 713,443 increased by 44,884 residents from 668,559 in 2006.
- Mississauga is Ontario's 3rd largest city surpassed only by the cities of Toronto and Ottawa.

- Mother Tongue is defined as the 1st language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the census.
- Canada has two official languages, English and French. 98% of Canada's population can speak one or both of the official languages and in Mississauga this is marginally lower at 96%.
- Mississauga has a diversity of linguistics.

- Persons whose language spoken at home other than English or French make up 11.1% of Canada’s total population, in comparison to 14.4% of Ontario’s population, 25.3% of the Toronto CMA’s population and 26.9% of Mississauga’s population.
- The Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) of Toronto includes all of Metropolitan Toronto and surrounding areas, including the Regions of Peel and York and a large portion of the Regions of Halton and part of the Region of Durham.


