

Open Call for Public Art Selection Committee Members

The City of Mississauga Public Art Program is requesting applications for the Public Art Selection Committee member roster. Please note that this is an open call with a rolling deadline. Application submittal does not guarantee participation on a committee. While all applications are appreciated, only those who meet the professional qualifications identified by the City of Mississauga Public Art Program will be added to the roster.

Public art projects commissioned by the City of Mississauga which have a budget over \$10,000 typically undergo an assessment by an arm's length art jury. This results in maintaining transparency, integrity and professionalism in the art selection process. Arts professionals may be local, regional or international, as to fit the scope of the project.

Roles and Responsibilities:

Members of this committee act voluntarily as informed peer assessors and provide recommendations on various public art proposals to City staff responsible for managing the Public Art Program. Committee recommendations assist in the review of City of Mississauga public art activities.

Time Commitment:

Project-specific committees will be assembled by City staff for each individual public art project. This is a volunteer position. Time commitments vary, however on average each committee member is expected to contribute approximately 10 to 15 hours of their time, and travel to meetings organized by City staff.

Eligibility:

All City of Mississauga Public Art Selection Committees are typically composed of 5 members but may range from 3 to 7. Prospective committee members must be experienced artists or arts/design professionals. This includes, but is not limited to: administrators in the arts, design or heritage fields, urban designers, landscape architects, architects, art educators and/or critics eligible to serve on an art jury.

Technical advisors may also be invited to join. Committee members will be remunerated for their time and effort, with the exception of project team members and/or City staff experts. Remuneration is based on industry best practices and representative of the current CARFAC Fee Schedule.



Canadian Artists' Representation/Le Front des artistes canadiens (CARFAC) is incorporated federally as a non-profit corporation that is the national voice of Canada's professional visual artists. Travel compensation will not be provided.
