

# Anthony Adamson elected to Ont. planning board

MISSISSAUGA—At the conclusion of the two-day conference 'Challenge to Change,' the annual meeting of the Ontario Division, Community

Planning Association of Canada, elected its officers for the forthcoming 1970-71 term of office.

Mrs. H. A. Elliott, chairman of the Kingston area Planning Board, was elected chairman of the Ontario body and Anthony Adamson of Mississauga was elected vice-chairman.

Head of the Acquisitions Division of Queen's University Library, Mrs. Elliott, a busy mother of five also serves her community through the Board of Governors, St. Lawrence College of Applied Arts and Technology; the Elizabeth Fry Society; the Canadian Federation of University Women; the Canadian Red Cross Society, etc.

The Hon. Darcy McKeough, the province's Municipal Affairs Minister, asked CPAC to accept the role of interpreter . . . of translating the government's planning aims for the benefit of the citizenry . . . and of referring the thoughts of the public back to his and other departments.

A well known Mississauga resident was also elected to the new CPAC leadership body.

Anthony A. Adamson, president of the Province of Ontario Council for the Arts, was elected vice chairman along with Dr. Alex L. Murray of Toronto, faculty of Environmental Studies at York University.
