35 years enough of works

Regional public works commissioner W.J. Anderson will retire next summer after 35 years of public service to Port Credit, Mississauga, and the Region of Peel.

Anderson began his career in Port Credit in 1949 when the Region's population was 42,000 people compared to the present 575,000.

He was the town and city engineer for Mississauga before joining the Region as its first public works commissioner when it was formed in January 1974. He has been in the position ever since.

In a report to regional council, Peel's chief administrative officer, Richard Frost, said, "It is not an exaggeration to say that no one has contributed more to the standard of municipal services we all enjoy and so often take for granted."

Peel will begin searching for a replacement for Anderson immediately.
