Builder Michael Artymko dies

Michael Artymko, the Businessman's Association builder of numerous apart- in West Metro, as well as the ments and stores in Ukrainian Branch of the Mississauga, including Canadian Legion. Artymko came to Canada in 1925 from the Ukraine where he was a professor of languages. In Canada, he worked on farms in the west and had various selling jobs before starting his career in building when he was in his 50's.

Described his business associates and friends as "a human dynamo", Artymko was active in the Ukrainian

Businessman's Association in West Metro, as well as the Ukrainian Branch of the Canadian Legion. He lived on 14th Avenue in Milliken.

A member of a World War One cavalry unit, Artymko donated much of his time and effort to outside building projects, including St. Peter and Paul's Catholic Church at Markham Road and 401, where the funeral mass was held Saturday morning.

Burial took place at Prospect Cemetery.

He leaves five children, sons Bohdam, Walter and Paul, two daughters Mary and Joan, and 23 grandchildren. He was predeceased by his wife Anna in 1969.
