By the time the building was ready for occupancy, busy group of women, had the linen ready and many of the extras that goes into the smooth running of a hospital. A few years ago she was asked to conduct a Round Table Conference at the Ontario Hospital Association convention held at the Royal York in Toronto.

Of her work in the Auxiliary, Mrs. Bell says, that it has given here greatest joy, she has found it so rewarding working with the marvellous women who devote so much of their time to this worth while work. It is certainly time consuming, for when we visited her last Saturday morning, she said it was the first, "day off" she has had for 40, days. But it is worth it, she said, I'm looking forward to my second term as president of this great organization with pleasure. The first year is always the hardest. "I'm delighted that at last we are going to have a psychiatric ward at South Peel, I am very interested in Mental Health, and feel that the time has come when the mentally disturbed patients can be treated at our own hospital.

Besides gardening, Mrs. Bell is greatly interested in interior decorating, which as one enters her home and sees the expert arrangement of her furniture, has that professional atouch. Just now she is alguercited in the plans to "flop over" her living room, and mays, "if I can only find the time."
