# A Busy Girl

COOKSVILLE — The co-ordinator of Toronto Township's Centennial Program is not what you would expect.

You may have thought of a retired school teacher or old maid librarian or even a retired military man.

But the person who has organized the township's Centennial year is a charming young woman full of ideas and energy.

Eleanore Blake, 36, has been working on the Centennial program since September 1965. When asked if she would like the job of co-ordinator, she answered "Yes."

"I have a love of public relations work and I have lots of ideas. Now I'm all caught up in the whirlpool of excitement."

Born in Toronto and raised in Hanover, Ont., Miss Blake graduated with a diploma course in recreation from the University of Western Ontario. In 1963 she wrote a thesis for the Fellowship in Society of Directors of Municipal Recreation of Ontario.



She has been assistant director of recreation with the township since 1959 but has been on loan to the Centennial Commission since 1965.
