Leonard Bluett, a familiar figure around the Mississauga Golf and Country Club for the past 27 years, has called it quits.

Familiarly known to at least two generations of golf buffs as "Bill", the 70-year-old Bluett, superintendent of ground and buildings, has officially retired on April 30.

A certified golf course superintendent, Bluett was responsible for getting the famous Mississauga course "green shape" for Canadian Opens in 1951 and 1965.

During the long service he had seen the most colourful figures of the golf world come and go, earning the respect of such glittering stars as Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, Sam Snead, Julius Boros, Stan Leonard and George Knudson.

A member of the board of directors for the Ontario Golf Course Superintendents Association, Bluett also held the president's position at one time.

As a fitting tribute for contributing "so much to golf", Mississauga held a testimonial dinner for the man who joined the club April 1, 1946.
