

Port Credit prof wins special award

Outstanding achievement in the field of drugs which affect the brain has earned a Port Credit man a special award.

Dr. Gregory Brown, professor and chairman of neurosciences and professor of psychiatry at McMaster University was recently presented with the Heinz Lehmann Award, given annually for research in the area of brain-affecting drugs.

The award, which consists of a plaque and gift of \$1,000, is sponsored by Hoffman LaRoche in honor of Dr. Heinz Lehmann, a distinguished Canadian investigator.

Dr. Brown received the award at the annual meeting of the Canadian College of Neuropsychopharmacology held in Saskatoon.

Dr. Brown has been with the Faculty of Health Sciences at McMaster since 1977, where he is an active investigator in the Brain/Behavior Research Program. He and his colleagues have made major contributions in the area of stress.

The award-winning professor is a graduate of the University of Toronto where he was a gold medalist and received his BA, MD and Doctorate in Psychiatry. In 1971, he received a PhD from the University of Rochester.

In 1980 Dr. Brown was the recipient of the John Dewan Award of the Ontario Mental Health Foundation.

Dr. Brown is married and the father of eight children.
