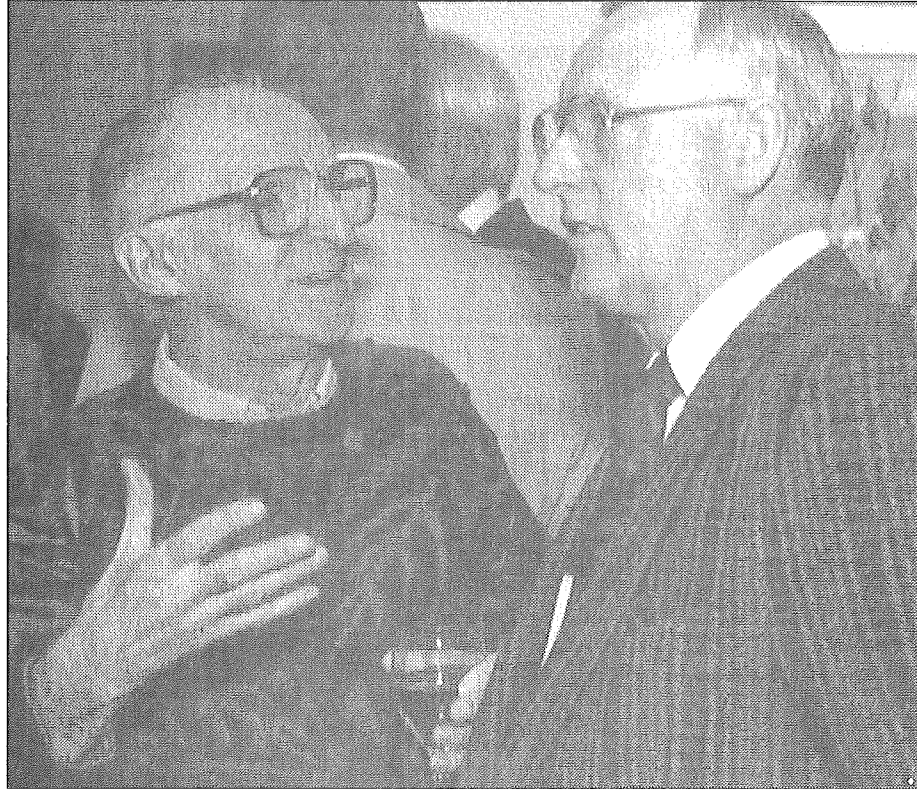

Visual Arts Ontario presents business seminars

Artists need to know their rights

Visual Arts Ontario (VAO) is presenting a four-part professional development series entitled, Artists' Business Seminars.

Legal Issues: The Artist's Contract, is the topic for the first seminar of the series, set for Wednesday, April 8, beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the Visual Arts Ontario Toronto office, 439 Wellington Street W.

Many artists consider a contract only after they've experienced difficulties and disagreements over an exhibition. Lawyer Paul Sanderson will outline the legal issues involved and will explain the rights and responsibilities of the visual artist and the gallery.

The fee is \$5 per session for VAO members and \$7 for non-members. Pre-registration is necessary. For information call 591-8883.

Joe Cairolì is the feature artist at Harbour Gallery during the month of March.

An accomplished artist and teacher, Cairolì first trained at the St. Martin's School of Art in London, England, as a sculptor before turning his skills to painting. He gained recognition when he won the Lowes-Dickenson Travelling Scholarship to Paris and Milan.

This dynamic impressionist has won many awards in Canada, most recently the COAA Purchase Award for his painting, *The Park Bench*. This painting was presented to Mayor Hazel McCallion and

will be part of the permanent art collection of the City of Mississauga.

Cairolì's mode of expression was created from his knowledge of Greek mythology, opera, ballet, music and from his influence of his native city of London,

England. His delightful images compel one to examine and imagine the stories told through his artistic talent.

His work will be featured until March 29 at Harbour Gallery, 32 Front St. For gallery hours call 271-1414.

The paintings and sculptures of Augustin Filipovic will be exhibited at The Art Gallery Of Peel until March 29.

Originally a native of Croatia, Filipovic studied at the Academy Of Fine Art in Rome, where he received intensive training in the classic tradition of sculpture.

Filipovic's work has been internationally exhibited and is represented in numerous public collections in Canada and around the world. He is also the instructor of the Mississauga Studio of Contemporary Sculpture, who meet weekly in Streetsville.
