Former citizen-of-year, Mary Cline named to regional housing authority

A long-time volunteer with the Cancer Society is the newest member of the Peel Regional Housing Authority.

Mary Cline, who moved to Mississauga in 1954, has been appointed as one of three federal representatives on the nine-member board. The housing authority manages the 1,016 assisted Ontario Housing Corporation units in Peel.

Cline, a Clarkson resident who helped to found the local cancer unit and four of its branches and drove cancer patients for treatment twice-a-week for 32 years, says "I want to be able to help things run smoothly and properly" by joining the board. She was Mississauga's citizen of the year in 1987.

The new appointee has also maintained a long-

time involvement with the Girl Guide movement and has been an active member of both the provincial and federal Progressive Conservative riding associations in Mississauga South.

The other two federal representatives on the board are Albert Post and Barbara Skinner. The provincial government appointees are Brian Schmidt and Carol Dineen, with two vacancies which the NDP government is expected to fill soon. The Region of Peel's two representatives are currently Peter Smith, former housing commissioner for the Region and Terry Laidlaw.

The Region has recommended that current housing commissioner Peter Maloney and Caledon Councillor Richard Whitehead join the board in May.
