
## Humanitarian Award given to veteran Peel police officer

Peel Regional Police Staff Superintendent Robert (Bert) Collins was named the second recipient of the Constable Dwayne Piukkala Humanitarian Award at a police appreciation night hosted Saturday by the Knights of Columbus of Mississauga

The Mississauga resident was selected in recognition of his charitable service and contributions to the community. He was out of town when the award was announced but Rod Piukkala, the detective sergeant in charge of the force's homicide bureau and brother of Dwayne Piukkala, accepted it for him.

Dwayne Piukkala was stabbed to death by a man in a Meadowvale apartment in August 1984. The award was established to honor his fellow police officers for their charity work
