

Peel B1061 *Crozier*
Crozier elects trial by judge

Jim Crozier, the former commissioner of Peel's social services department, chose to be tried by judge alone on two charges of indecent assault involving children.

Crozier will appear Friday, Dec. 8, 1990, to set a trial date, a Brampton provincial court judge decided Monday.

Crozier, a Mississauga resident, took early retirement from his high-profile position with Peel in August 1988, shortly after the charges became known.

Crozier pleaded guilty early last January to two other charges of indecent exposure laid following a three-month investigation by Peel Regional Police into sex offences in a washroom at Rockwood Mall in Mississauga. He was fined \$700. A third set of sex-related charges was laid shortly afterward. Two counts of indecent assault on a female were laid last December. Crozier will appear in court on those charges Feb. 9, 1990.
