Culham joins Army's appeal

There's a new soldier behind the shield this year.

The Salvation Army's 1988 Red Shield Appeal has named Ward 6 councillor David Culham as its residential chairman.

Culham, a Mississauga resident for 17 years, was first elected to council in 1974 and was re-elected in 1981, following a five-year absence. The results of his work in the community include a computerized traffic control system and the successful Blue Box recycling program.

Culham has picked up some laurels during his tenure — he received the 1986

individual award from the Recycling Council of Ontario, and was honored by the City of Mississauga with the naming of the 15-kilometre David C. Culham Trail for his efforts in environmental preservation.

Culham's involvement with the Red Shield Appeal includes preparations for this year's one-night blitz, to be held Monday, May 2.

The goal for 1988's residential campaign is about \$380,000, a 15 per cent increase over last year's total raised of close to \$335,000.
