Lyle Doering

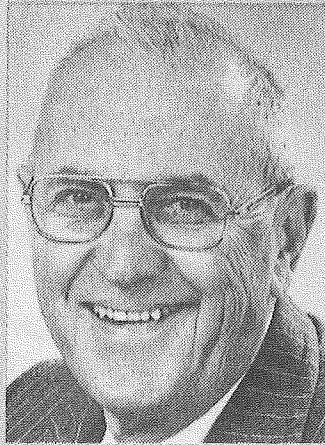
Mississauga's third Citizen of the Year was Lyle Doering, who was honored at a banquet on April 25, 1982 at the Credit Valley Golf and Country Club.

When Doering was chosen the most outstanding volunteer for the year, he said: "Many people give of their time and are not recognized. I do hope I can measure up to the honor." Doering added that he wished to share the honor with the four other finalists that year.

When Doering retired from the position of vice-president of public relations for Stelco Incorporated, he focused his time and energy on community service.

When Mississauga Hospital was in need of funds for expansion, Doering worked as a volunteer campaign officer and was determined to reach the remarkable goal of \$1,750,000 despite a poor economic climate.

The 75th anniversary celebration of the Mississauga Golf and Country Club was also among the many accomplishments this community-minded citizen had

As one of the Board of Friends for the Mississauga Hospital Foundation, Doering was also instrumental in raising \$1.25 million to help the foundation purchase the first CAT scanner available for Mississaugans.
