A brave woman

Mississauga's Mary Dohey proudly displays the Cross of Valor she received last week from the Canadian Government. She is the only living recipient of the award which has been given out only three times. The stewardess, who also works as a nurse on weekends at St. Joseph's Hospital in Toronto, was credited with talking a hijacker into surrendering to authorities after a terrorizing flight across western Canada and parts of the United States in 1972. Miss Dohey, now in Europe on a skling vacation, describes herself as a very private person who has been "completely overwhelmed" by the publicity generated by her heroism.
