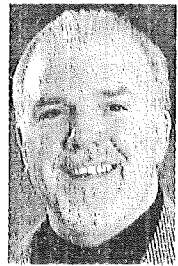


City's history brought out in speaker series

The Events that Shaped Mississauga speaker series continues Tuesday with a look at how the downtown core started to come together with the development of Square One Shopping Centre.

The opening of Square One nearly 36 years ago caused more than traffic jams on Hurontario St. — it set in motion the development of Mississauga's City Centre. Duquette, president

of Ad-Venture Sight & Sound Ltd., will talk about how McLaughlin, a prominent builder and developer, turned a cow pasture into Square One.

McLaughlin's "right-hand man," Duquette, will also provide insight on the vision behind the developer's plan for the city core.

The presentation is the fourth installment of the Events that Shaped Mississauga speaker series. It's followed by *Hurricane Hazel: Storm of the Century* (Oct. 15) and *The Mississauga Train Derailment* (Nov. 12). Both sessions take place at Port Credit Library, starting at 7:30 p.m.

The series was created by Mississauga's four heritage partners — Heritage Advisory Committee, Heritage Mississauga, Mississauga Library System and Museums of Mississauga — to highlight significant events and people in the city.

Heritage Mississauga historian Matthew Wilkinson, who chairs the speaker series com-

mittee, says the topics mark major milestones in the city's history.

Former Mississauga fire chief Gordon

Bentley will talk about his involvement in the evacuation prompted by the train derailment, which occurred Nov. 10, 1979.
