# ROBBY FABBRI CELEBRATES 1ST STANLEY CUP WIN

Local sports fans might be more preoccupied with NBA Finals, but over in the hockey world the NHL's St. Louis Blues were busy picking up their first Stanley Cup on Wednesday, June 12.

Among those hoisting the Cup for a victory lap after the Blues' 4-1 victory over the Boston Bruins was Mississauga's own Robby Fabbri. Fabbri, an alum of both Our Lady of Mercy Elementary and St. Aloysius Gonzaga Secondary schools, picked up four points in his 10 playoff appearances - one goal and three assists. He played in Game 2 and 3 of the final series, but was a healthy scratch in the title-winning Game 7.

Fabbri, 23, played his 2011-12 season with the Mississauga Rebels, followed by two seasons with the Ontario Hockey League's Guelph Storm, before being picked up by the Blues in the first round of the 2014 NHL Entry Draft.

In 2015, he was also part of Canada's gold medal-winning effort at the World Juniors.

The centre/left wing, who wears the No. 15 jersey, missed most of the 2016-16 season and 2017 Stanley Cup playoffs after tearing his right ACL.
