

Fleming led hydro

Bert Fleming, who spent his retirement years volunteering around the world on various church projects, has died.

Fleming, 75, was the general manager of Hydro Mississauga for most of the three decades he worked for the utility.

"He was a man of great character, a man of principles and a very just employer," recalled Minoo Treasurywalla, who worked with Fleming for many years.

The two men began working together at the Cooksville Hydro-Electric Commission before local utilities were amalgamated into Hydro Mississauga.

The hallmark of Fleming's leadership at hydro was "the best service at the lowest cost," recalled Treasurywalla.

Last year, Fleming received the highest honor possible from the Anglican Church for his volunteer work as an overseas missionary, lay reader and a lay member of the church association.

Fleming took his engineering expertise to a number of places around the world, including Haiti, the Windward Islands, the Arctic, the Northwest Territories and Jerusalem.

Fleming died of cancer after a brief illness. He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Elizabeth, his son Derek, daughter Nancy and son-in-law Peter Crawford and his sister Miriam.

A memorial service will be held at his long-time church, St. Peter's Anglican, Monday at 11 a.m.
