Liver tot's story on TV tomorrow

A tot whose fight for life generated an outpouring of support from Mississaugans will be the star of a CBC television documentary tomorrow.

Brittany Giberson, 2, who has spent a large part of her life in hospital, will be featured on *The Health Show* as it documents her battle with a rare genetic disorder.

Brittany was diagnosed with tyrosinemia, a rare disorder that attacks the liver. The only cure was an organ transplant.

The operation September 8 was a success but the disease had taken a heavy toll on the Brittany's tiny body.

According to the tot's aunt, Stacey Roberts, Brittany suffered organ rejection and was sent back into hospital a week before Christmas. Released Christmas Eve, Brittany is making up for lost time.

Roberts, who has been fundrais-

ing for Brittany's long-term care, said the little girl is now walking and talking up a storm. "She's a happy little girl," Roberts said.

As for her television debut,

Brittany "loves being in front of the camera. She's a real ham," Roberts said.

The Health Show, at 7 p.m., will present the inside story of what it's like to live with
