# Senior wins \$2-million jackpot

Allison Henry, Mississauga's newest millionaire, is packing her bags in search of a new home after walking away with a tidy \$2-million jackpot in the weekend's Lotto 6/49 draw.

After all, a hostel is no place for a millionaire. Henry has been living at a Streetsville hostel for a number of years since being involved in an acci-

dent in 1976, when she suffered minor brain damage and was forced to go on government disability pension. A nice apartment is all the plans the 61-year-old woman has for the immediate future.

Henry knew she held the winning ticket Saturday night after the draw, but she thought she would be sharing the \$2,040,186.10 with a number of winners. It wasn't until Monday night she found out she would be pocketing the whole bundle.

Henry, who is not married, says she will be sharing her wealth with a

brother in Ottawa and a few other relatives and friends.

She says an apartment would be great, but she could not look after a home because of her condition.

Henry said she has been buying lottery tickets since January of 1984, but this is the first one to make the big payoff.

She maintains she has no ambition to take off on trips now, but admits that could change when the big win sinks in.

"I might go visit my brother and aunts," she says.
