

# High-flying career in sight for Peel Region's top student

Pablo Iglesias' parents don't think he spends enough time studying, says the 19-year-old Lorne Park Secondary School student.

But they surely can't complain too loudly about their son's study habits. They were good enough for a Grade 13 graduating average of 97.8 per cent which made him the top Ontario Scholar in all of the schools operated by the Peel Board of Education.

Pablo has too many other interests to devote himself completely to studying. Besides, he says, "When you're uptight

that's when you do worse" on examinations. Iglesias, who lives with his family on Springhill Dr. in Mississauga was surprised that his marks were the highest in the region.

A member of the school band who plays the drums, Iglesias also plays on the Clarkson-Lorne Park Indians team in the Halton Country Baseball League and has a part-time job in the photography department at Sears department store.

Pablo took nine Grade 13 subjects, three more than are required. He took three of them last year.

His marks included a rare 100 in a special engineering course which is only offered at Lorne Park.

"A 100 mark is always hard to get," says the student. "Last year I got 99.6 per cent in Grade 12 math."

Pablo enjoyed the engineering course so much that he is enrolling in that discipline this fall at the University of Toronto. He's interested in eventually becoming an aerospace engineer.

The student's other marks included 99 in algebra, 99 in relations and functions, 99 in calculus, 95 in physics, 95 in accounting, 92 in English, 90 in chemistry and 90 in French.

Iglesias celebrated his academic accomplishment with a month-long vacation in Spain in July.
