

# Former MPP facing fraud, theft charges

## Terry Jones has a date in Provincial Court

Former Mississauga North MPP, Terry David Jones, will appear Aug. 23 in the Clarence St. Provincial Court in Brampton to have a date set for his trial on two counts of fraud and one count of theft.

Jones was summonsed yesterday to appear in the Peel Provincial Court House to face two counts of fraud over \$1,000 and one count of theft over \$1,000.

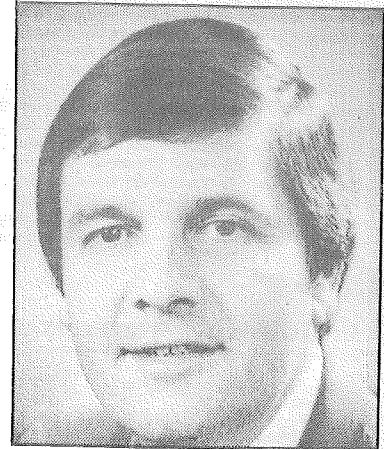
The charges stem from alleged movements of money between banks in the Mississauga area.

Jones, who was once touted as Cabinet material in the Bill Davis Progressive Conservative Government, was ordered last March to

cease having an active part in the insurance business he founded.

At that time, the Registered Insurance Brokers of Ontario (RIBO) took away Jones' insurance licence after his firm "pleaded guilty to operating while in a new deficit position, failure to meet its trust obligations as they became due, failure to maintain accounting records in accordance with the regulations and to filing position reports containing false or misleading information."

Jones was Mississauga North MPP for 10 years before being defeated by Liberal Party rookie candidate Steven Offer in the May 2, 1985 provincial election.
