## Mississauga-raised actor Simu Liu wins at ACTRA Awards 4

The show recently won the series ensemble award as part of the 15th Annual ACTRA Awards in Toronto, which were presented during a gala on Saturday, Feb. 25 at The Carlu.

nadian family-owned convenience store in Toronto, won in the outstanding performance female category.

More good news for Liu and the show could be on the horizon, as both he and Kim's Convenience are nominated in a number of categories at the Canadian Screen Awards.

Also, his new TV show, Taken, made its debut on Monday, Feb. 27 on NBC. On the show, he plays ex-CIA analyst Faaron, who's part of main character Bryan Mills' team.
