

Realtor recognized with service award

When David Mosley isn't selling houses in Streetsville and Erin Mills, he devotes his time and efforts to the annual Bread & Honey Festival.

The Streetsville resident and sales representative with Royal LePage Meadowtowne Realty has been president of the festival committee for four years, helping one of

Mississauga's largest and longest-running festivals continue its traditions.

For his outstanding efforts in making the community a better place in which to live and raise a family, Mosley has received the Ronald E. Sanderson Community Service Award from the Mississauga Real Estate Board (MREB).

The award recognizes a full-time MREB member with more than five years' experience whose exceptional

volunteerism in the city has had a positive impact.

It's named for the longtime member of the board, who served as president in 1963. The award was created in 1986 to honour the memory of the MREB past-president, who dedicated his life to serving the community while maintaining an active career in real estate.

Mosley, a father of two, will be presented with the award at a cer-

emony on May 17 at City Hall.

He said he's surprised and honoured by the recognition.

"What I do is for the community," said Mosley, adding it also gives him great satisfaction being able to help the Bread & Honey Festival continue to highlight Streetsville and its history, traditions and community spirit.

"When you're in the parade and you see the love and devotion ... it's really quite something," he said.

Sandra Pitts, the festival's events and sponsorship coordinator, says Mosley has contributed an enormous amount of time and energy to the festival, working closely on things that include insurance needs, permits and contracts.

"People don't always realize what it takes to put on a festival of this magnitude, which takes place over three days and includes a large parade ...," she said.

Pitts added Mosley has a real passion for the festival and is always looking for ways to improve it.

"On a daily basis he is sending out e-mails and on the phone making calls pertaining to the festival," she said. "It is not unusual for me to receive 10-15 calls and e-mails from him in a day, always making himself available for us around his busy schedule."

Alex Oscai, who owns Royal LePage Meadowtowne Realty along with Gloria Riddall, adds Mosley's tireless efforts are also reflected in his work.
