Publisher already 'at home'

Ken Nugent already feels "at home" in his new post.

The Brampton Guardian publisher, who last week was named publisher of *The Mississauga News* as well, says he's always dreamed of leading the newspaper in his community.

"It's a pleasure for me to return and a tremendous opportunity to be publisher of the newspaper of (my) hometown," said Nugent, who started his career at Metroland Media Group in 1973 as an advertising sales rep at *The Mississauga News*.

Nugent said although it's difficult to fill the shoes of former publisher Ron Lenyk, he's looking forward to the challenge of better serving the community in which he has lived for nearly 30 years and raised his four children.

In his role as vice-president and regional publisher of Metroland, Nugent will continue to operate 16 other newspapers in the newly amalgamated Peel Region and South West Ontario division.

He says the amalgamation will allow the company to take full advantage of the size of

Peel and "the synergies that present themselves, including creating new revenue opportunities and maximizing efficiencies in the way we do business."

Nugent said he hopes to pool together the "tremendous amount of talent and skills" from the newspapers to provide better coverage for readers.

"Both Mississauga and Brampton are large newspapers and both are among the most successful community newspapers not only in Canada, but in North America as well," Nugent said. "We're looking to capitalize on the resources we have and use them as best we can."

Nugent first became publisher of *The Richmond Hill Liberal* in 1986. He was transferred to *The Brampton Guardian* in 1991, where his role expanded to lead newspapers in Georgetown, Caledon, Erin, Orangeville and southwestern Ontario.

Nugent plans to split his time between the Mississauga and Brampton offices.

Meanwhile, Lenyk has moved to a new position as vice-president of strategic newspaper support at *The News'* parent company, Torstar Corporation.
