The former Miss Mississauga first made her mark on the Canadian entertainment scene back in the fall of '74 during the Miss Canada Pageant on CTV network, when she won the national talent contest with a voice that was to open the doors to a career in the entertainment business.

She has been singing ever since, appearing across Canada in front of various bands. Her latest gig took her to Calgary and the west

The 30-year-old one-time beauty queen embarked on her political singing career during the Joe Clark PC leadership convention in Winnipeg last year. She was reengaged to sing at the follow-up PC convention in Ottawa when Mulroney became the leader of the Opposition.

Jacquie is not the sole Mississauga entertainer on the Mulroney election trail. The drummer of the band that backs up Robichaud is another graduate of the Mississauga entertainment school, Dwight Wheiler.

"It is really exciting to be part of the election campaign, it gives you a good feeling," says Jacquie.
