

*Mississauga lawyer  
wins Canada medal*

A Mississauga lawyer who is one of Canada's top experts on taxation law has won the prestigious Law Society Medal.

Douglas Sherbaniuk was one of five lawyers to recently win the Law Society of Upper Canada's coveted medal for 1990. In awarding the honor, Law Society treasurer James Spence cited Sherbaniuk's "dedicated service to the profession in the area of taxation law."

He added that the medal also "recognizes the high standard of academic excellence that you have set and the respect for the law that you have imbued in your students." Sherbaniuk has been a professor of law for the University of Toronto since 1965.

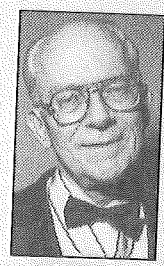
Since 1967, Sherbaniuk has been a director of the Canadian Tax Foundation, an independent non-profit research body which tries to improve the national tax structure.

A longtime Mississauga resident, the Law Society Medal winner was a citizen member of the Mississauga planning board from 1968-73, serving the last three years as its chairman.

From 1973-85, Sherbaniuk was a member of the Hydro Mississauga commission.

Sherbaniuk has a BA in modern languages and a bachelor of laws degree from the University of Alberta and a master of laws degree from Columbia University.

During his career, Sherbaniuk has been a senior staff member of the Royal Commission on Taxation, has been a tax consultant, and has frequently spoken on tax issues.
