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Shipp announces major commercial development

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Harold Shipp, president of the Shipp Corporation, has announced plans to build four executive office buildings on the Applewood Farms property which is opposite Mississauga City Hall on the east of

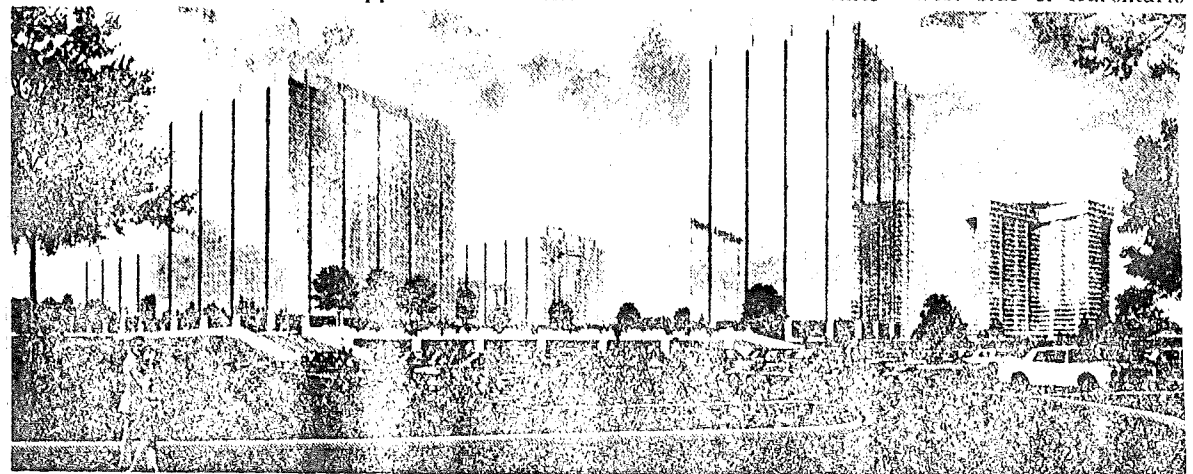
Hurontario St. Registered under the name Mississauga Executive Centre, the complex will have four buildings of similar architectural design. All will face inwards to a centre court. Shipp said the

buildings will be of different heights ranging from eight to 18 stories. There will be a total of 853,000 square feet of office space available. The exterior will feature light gray mirrored glass set off with a silhouette of white

precast concrete pillars with a cap of similar material. "This complementary design has been integrated to create an executive centre which will add to the larger city core plan already well under way on the west side of Hurontario

St." Shipp said. If approval is received from City Council, Shipp said construction of the first eight-storey building will start in early 1978 with occupancy by fall of next year. "The Mississauga Executive Centre will give further recognition to the former mayor of Mississauga, Robert Speck, by having his name on the parkway leading east from City Centre Dr. and across the Cooksville Creek to intersect with Burnhamthorpe Rd. about 1,000 feet east of Hurontario St.," Shipp said. He said he plans to build one or two

buildings similar to Applewood Landmark in the complex. He said he could think of "no better location in Mississauga to build the next prestige condominium apartments which will provide downtown city proximity to Mississaugans who want fine living in a high rise building, leaving the chores of gardening and snow removal to others." Shipp complimented all those involved for the speed at which the "monumental task" of preparing the plan was completed and said he hopes City Council will move as quickly as possible in approving the plan.
