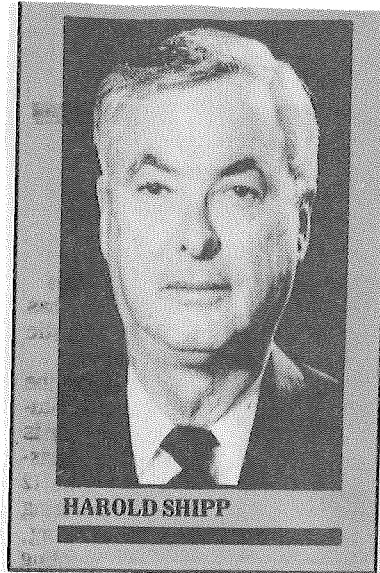

Shipp, family *Feel Bios. Rk.* honored *May 10-89 MN* by peers

Harold G. Shipp and the Shipp family have received a unique distinction from the United States-based Urban Land Institute (ULI).

At the ULI annual meeting, held recently in New Orleans, Harold Shipp was honored by his peers, who elected him to the post of honorary trustee.

He is the first Canadian member to be so honored.

The ULI has a membership of approximately 2,000 and an additional 4,000 associate members who are considered the elite in their industry and responsible for developing the finest real estate properties on the continent.

It was formed some 50 years ago to represent the voice of architects, academics, and planning officials striving for excellence in architecture, design and economic success, while creating fine communities in which to work and live.

By his election to this group, Shipp has been singularly honored for his continuing contribution to ULI. During his nearly 37 years of membership, he has served as a member of the executive council and more recently as a trustee. He was made a life council member in 1988.

Both Harold G. Shipp, and his father, the late Gordon S. Shipp, served in the presidency of the Canadian Home Builders Association, a feat which has yet to be duplicated in the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) in the U.S.A.

Gordon S. Shipp was posthumously inducted into NAHB Hall of Fame in Washington, D.C., in 1988. The ULI's recent recognition of his son, Harold, is seen as an indication of the high esteem in which the Mississauga family firm is held in the 66th year of its establishment by Gordon S. Shipp.
