Siller may give council a crack

Carolynne Siller may seek the job as Ward 2 councillor in the November 12 municipal election after all.

Siller is now considering running in the election because of the emerging possibility that the minority government at Queen's Park could operate for a minimum of two years.

The New Democratic Party has apparently received agreement from the Liberals to a minimum two-year period before the next election as part of a general agreement that the NDP will support the Liberals.

Siller, a Liberal, lost in Mississauga South to former Ward 2 councillor Margaret Marland by 1,565 votes on May 2. Siller said at that time that she would not seek the Ward 2 council seat in November, but would rather wait to run in the next provincial election. But since then, the

possibility of a longer term for the minority government has emerged. If Siller were to win the seat in November, she would be elected for a three-year term.

Asked if she would then want to run again in a provincial election toward the end of a municipal term, Siller said that is possible.

Council plans to advertise the vacancy and interview interested candidates before making an appointment.
