A service station, located beside the milk store where Barbara Turnbull was shot, will stay open 24 hours a day and donate two cents per litre of gas pumped for the next month to her benefit fund.

The Pronto station, at the corner of the South Sheridan Way and Benedet Dr., has a number of fundraising activities planned to aid Turnbull who is now a quadriplegic.

The "Christmas Fund Month" for Barbara starts today and concludes Dec. 17. As well as donations from the pumping of gas, the station will sell a number of products at attractive retail prices. These include food products, beverages, and firewood.

Andy Pruchnicki, manager of four Pronto stations in Mississauga, says 100 per cent of those funds will be donated to Turnbull.

Plans are also under way to provide car washes, using students from Clarkson Secondary School, which Turnbull attended.

At the conclusion of the month-long fundraising, Pruchnicki himself intends to run from the station to Sunnybrook Hospital, where Turnbull has been receiving care. He will be accepting pledges for the run during the next month.
