
Peter Van Rhijn in focus

Some may know him as their friendly family doctor, others may have met him on the cross-country

But it's Dr. Peter Van Rhiin's camera that is making his name known around Mississauga. The Streetsville general practitioner is easily one of Canada's premier nature photographers.

His entertaining and informative slide shows have taken him across southern Ontario and into the United States where he consistently shows them to sold-out audiences. Recently, in Boston, as many as 1.700 people witnessed the Dutchborn doctor's show in a single weekend.

Locally, Dr. Van Rhijn's threeprojector shows are sold out simply on word of mouth. Technical excellence, combined with an eye for exquisite beauty in the natural landscape, is evidence of a Van Rhijn photograph.

many of his pictures, including those from his latest show, "Places I've Seen," are taken on holidays, the majority of his prize-winning photographs are made right here in the fields and meadows around his Mississauga home.

"I regard photography like jogging. It's a positive addiction," he explains. It's the thrill of finding something very beautiful in the camera's viewfinder that gets the adrenalin going."

Producing the slide shows is like a "second-generation thrill" when the photographer is able to take his slides to make a separate beautiful image complete with music and special effects.

He credits much of his success to his wife. Lynda, for her support and understanding.

All of his work to date has been done in 35-mm format but he has recently moved up to a larger film camera to get higher-quality prints which he sells at his gallery.
